

# *The River Ridge High School Chapter of the National Honor Society*

**Please read this application in its entirety.**

What is NHS? The National Honor Society is the frontrunner of organizations that promotes appropriate recognition for the students who reflect outstanding accomplishments in the areas of scholarship, character, leadership, and service. College admissions often regard National Honor Society membership as a valid indicator that the applicant will succeed at the post-secondary education level. The Honor Society prospect should already exhibit academic achievement, leadership, either overtly or covertly, honorable and admirable character, and service that demonstrates the prospect is willing to use talents and skills for the improvement of society. One must keep in mind that induction to the National Honor Society is quite an honor and accomplishment.

## **Application Information and Directions**

- All sophomores and juniors who have a cumulative high school GPA of 3.5 or above may apply for admission to the RRHS Chapter of the National Honor Society
- Application forms can be found on the school website or from the advisor, Maria Cardo, for those students that meet the GPA requirements.
- **Admission is not automatic.** Applying does not guarantee admission into the organization. In addition to having the required GPA, applicants must demonstrate significant accomplishment and/or participation in **all** areas indicated on the application form. It is necessary to have some accomplishments in each area.
- All activities, accomplishments, etc. included in the application must have taken place during high school. Do not include anything that occurred before you were in high school. Doing so could jeopardize your chances for admission.
- Make sure your application is neat and legible.
- Alcohol and drug violations are in breach of National By-Laws. Do not apply if you have had any alcohol or drug violations.
- Please complete all sections. Do not be modest. Every bit of information that you provide may be used by the RRHS NHS Faculty Council to assist with the selection process.
- Be sure to document all hours and activities with a teacher signature or with official letterhead stationary (especially for non-school related activities).
- All application forms must be completed and returned **directly** to the advisor on February 26, 2021 no later than 2:15 PM. **Late applications WILL NOT be accepted.** NHS Induction Ceremony will be held in the RRHS Theater at a date to be announced later.
- If membership is denied, it may simply mean that all four requirements were not fulfilled. Furthermore, past disciplinary occurrences may prevent admittance to NHS based on the severity of the offense.















8. **MANDATORY ESSAY:** Please respond to one of the three prompts below with a typed and double-spaced organized essay of a maximum one page. Please note that failure to adhere to the requested format will work against you. Your essay must be submitted at the same time as your application.

- 1) Share an event in your life that has influenced your character.
- 2) Explain what services you have given to the community and/or school.
- 3) Define your leadership role on campus as well as in the community.

9. **RECOMMENDATIONS:** A minimum of 5 teacher recommendations are required. Chosen teachers will score you based on the following criteria: Reliability, Responsibility, Work Habits, Cooperation/Attitude, and Attendance. In the space below, please list the names of the teachers you wish to be contacted for your recommendations. Please note: you are not responsible for acquiring the recommendation, you are simply responsible for acquiring the name and signature of the teachers you wish to serve as your recommender. If you are attending PHCC or FLVS, please give forms to your most recent RRHS teachers. For ease of the teacher, please print their name and fill in their room number. If you are new to RRHS, please see Maria Cardo well before the deadline for information about teacher recommendations.

10. **Professional Reference:** In addition to 5 teacher recommendations, you must have one professional reference / Letter of Recommendation from an outside source that knows you professionally and personally. This outside source cannot be a parent/guardian/family member. This letter must include how the person knows you and how/why you would be an ideal candidate for National Honor Society. This letter must be on official letterhead.

## NHS SCORING RUBRIC FOR MEMBERSHIP CONSIDERATION

**Rubric:** The total number of possible points is 15. The minimum number of points needed for consideration is 12. A maximum of 5 is available in categories of Character, Leadership, and Service. **There is no rounding up of scores.** (NOTE: You earn points ONLY under the current year column.)

**SCHOLARSHIP** - Students with a 3.5 weighted GPA are eligible for membership consideration. (Point scale: 1-5)

**CHARACTER** – (Character Point Scale: 1-5)

These scores are based on Letter(s) of Recommendation and the average of teacher recommendations in the areas of reliability, responsibility, work habits, cooperation/attitude, attendance, and academic honesty. All teachers will have an opportunity to comment on candidates before selection is announced.

**LEADERSHIP** — Belonging to any clubs in high school demonstrates leadership qualities. One point will be awarded for active membership in the following: Interact, Student Council, Key Club, SADD, and other honor societies, church organizations, Scouts, sports, other clubs. One more point will be awarded for office held within the organization. Have club sponsor sign next to hours or have a letter documenting membership and leadership.

On each grade level, your points are on the left and the rubric points are on the right.

**SERVICE** — One point will be awarded for every 10 hours of service for Sophomores and 15 hours of service for Juniors. Have a letter or signature documenting all hours. Official documentation on organization letterhead is required when service is completed through an off-campus agency.

Again, each of the latter three sections has a maximum of 5 points, and the highest possible total score is 15. A student must have 12 or more points, a completed eligibility packet, and a well-developed essay to be considered for membership. **THERE IS NO ROUNDING UP OF SCORES.**
