Home-School Connection

What Are the Coins? What you'll need---Some coins

Ask your child the following questions: I have three coins in my pocket. They are worth 7 cents. What do I have? (a nickel and 2 pennies) I have three coins in my pocket. They are worth 16 cents. What do I have? (a dime, a nickel, a penny) I have three coins in my pocket. They are worth 11 cents. What do I have? (2 nickels and 1 penny) I have three coins in my pockets. They are worth 30 cents. What do I have? (3 dimes) I have six coins in my pocket. They are worth 30 cents. What could I have? (1 quarter and 5 pennies or 6 nickels). This problem has more than one answer. It is challenging for children to experience problems like this. I have coins in my pocket, which have a value of 11 cents. How many coins could I have? This activity is part of our Parent-School Compact 19-20
