

INFLUENZA

COVID continues to get so much attention that it is easy to forget about other illnesses like influenza, but it will not forget you.

Let's fight the flu together!

The best way to protect your family from influenza is to get vaccinated each year.

Influenza (flu) is a contagious disease of the respiratory tract (nose, throat, and lungs) that can lead to serious complications, including pneumonia and the worsening of other chronic health conditions. Flu symptoms may include fever, headache, extreme tiredness, dry cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, and muscle aches.

Follow good health guidelines: wash hands frequently. Eat right, exercise, and get plenty of rest to help boost your immunity to fight the effects of colds and flu. Do the elbow cough and sneeze, and disinfect hot spots at school, work, and home (telephones, appliances, faucets, light switches, door handles, tv remotes etc.).

If you get the flu treat the symptoms, but avoid giving aspirin to children because it may cause a rare but serious illness called Reye syndrome.

It has been a true pleasure getting to meet all of the students here at Clayton Elementary. Last month, I was able to complete classroom guidance lessons in every class. It was so awesome meeting the students and getting to learn a little bit more about them through our discussions about what it means to be responsible. This month we are celebrating Kindness Day (Saturday, November 13th) with a mini kindness spirit week. Please see the daily theme below. To celebrate what it means to be kind, students in grades

first and second grade will have a classroom guidance lesson with a focus on what it means to be bucket fillers (show kindness). We will have discussions, read a story, and complete a classroom activity that will introduce and reinforce the concept of being a bucket filler and not a bucket dipper. Students in third and fourth grade will also discuss what it means to be kind and how a random act of kindness can change someone's day. We will read a story, watch the kindness boomerang video, and complete an activity. Our kindergarten students will have a lesson on the importance of listening and how we can listen with our whole body and how that can show kindness through active listening. They will read a story and make their own listening ears headband to take home.
