COUNSEOR'S MESSAGE

November is the perfect month to begin learning about our "Choose Love" value of Gratitude. Primarily, we are grateful to you - parents and caregivers - for the wonderful support you give to your child(ren) emotionally and academically. Beyond that, so many of you make time in your busy schedules to support the school in one way or another - we do see you, appreciate you, and extend a heartfelt mahalo.

If you have a moment, we'd invite you to share in a family discussion about Gratitude. Here are a few sample questions you might talk over:

- If you can think about a time you felt really happy, why do you think are some of the reasons you felt that way? (What are you doing? Where are you? Do you have something you value with you in that moment? Who is around?)


