Dear Parents and Guardians,



Hello Families!

This past October we had a big focus on Unity Day. As a school we are continuing to have conversations about kindness, inclusion, and acceptance. We are also expecting our students to practice these behaviors everyday here at Pauoa School.

This month we will be working on Emotion Management. We will be talking about recognition and identification of feelings and how to calm down if and when these strong feeling take over our bodies.

The driving question about emotion management:

Can I recognize and identify my own feelings? Do I know how to calm down when I am feeling upset or uncomfortable? How can I help someone else if I know they are feeling uncomfortable?

In Physical Education all students will be working on manipulative skills- these include: throwing, tossing, striking, and catching. Kindergarten through second grade will be continuously practicing these skills, while grades 3 through 5 will be assessed on these skills.

Continue to be on the lookout for your child's Social Emotional Learning and Physical Activity Journal this week. Journals need to be completed before their next PE specials class and turned in on the day of their specials.

Please keep actively moving with your child – aim for a family activity like walking, going to the park/beach, or exercising in your house for 60 minutes a day.

REMINDER- please help support your child by checking if they have packed their water bottle on their special's day rotation and if they are wearing their shoes!

STEM/Science: Mr. Sutherland

October was a busy month for our science students. Here are a couple of the highlights.

First grade continued their life science STEM investigations with the nest building challenge. Students spent time researching how birds build nests in the wild and then applied that knowledge to building nests of their own. Later, they will use what they learned from this lesson to build solid and secure structures for their own use. This lesson helps them meet the first grade NGSS standard 1-LS1-1: Use materials to design a solution to a human problem by mimicking how plants and/or animals use their external parts to help them survive, grow, and meet their needs.

Fourth grade has been working hard on their own STEM challenge, the Cheeto lift. The students need to use a collection of Legos to build a platform for lifting cheetos five feet into the air using a pulley. Any Cheetos they get to the top of the lift they can keep. For this challenge the students are required to work through all the steps of the engineering design process in order to come up with a successful solution.

I wanted to follow up on the information Mr. Arakaki presented at our Pauoa Ohana Night Community Meeting/Pumpkin Carving activity on October 29, 2019 regarding Title 1. We are eligible for Title 1 based on our free and reduced threshold of 53% with the minimum being 47.2%. We are seeing a decrease in the percentage of students qualifying for free and reduced lunch and soon Pauoa School may not be eligible. Title 1 funding provides for all students at Pauoa. See below for the list of Title 1 expenditures. Pauoa School truly serves the purpose of Title 1 as all students benefit from the program. Let me know if you have any questions.
