Does it seem like there's never enough time in the day to get everything done? Feel like you're always running late? Here are some tips for taking control of your time and organizing your life.

- 1) Make a "To Do" List Every Day Most important things at the top of the list
- 2) Use Spare Minutes Wisely Get some reading done on the bus; kill 2 birds w/ 1 stone
- 3) It's Okay to Say "No"- Keep your short and long-term priorities in mind
- 4) Find the Right Time You'll work more efficiently if you figure out when you work best
- 5) Review Your Notes Every Day You'll reinforce what you've learned, so you need less time to study
- 6) Get a Good Night's Sleep Running on empty makes the days seem longer and your tasks seem more difficult
- 7) Communicate Your Schedule to Others If phone calls become distractions, turn your ringer off
