Staying Healthy During Cold & Flu Season

The best way to combat the flu, covid and other illnesses this season is through preventive measures.

- * Wash your hands frequently with soap and water for 20 seconds or use hand sanitizing gel.
- Get your flu vaccine and discuss with your health care provider if you are due for other vaccinations.
- ❖ Stay home and limit your contact with others if you are sick.
- ❖ Avoid touching your nose, mouth, and eyes.
- ❖ Avoid sharing eating utensils and sharing drinks.
- Get enough sleep
- ❖ Eat right and exercise regularly

Please do NOT send your child to school if he/she has or has had:

- ♣ A fever more than 100.1 degrees within the last 24 hours. Must be fever free without the aid of medication for 24 hours.
- ♣ Vomiting or diarrhea within the last 24 hours
- ♣ Continuous coughing, not relieved with cough medicine

Greetings CES families

It has been a pleasure meeting with all of our students during our monthly classroom guidance lessons. It was great to see familiar faces and welcome those who are new to Clayton Elementary. For the month of October, we will be focusing on listening and empathy/compassion. Our kindergarten and first graders will complete a lesson on the importance of listening and what whole body listening looks like when we read *Howard B. Wigglebottom Learns to Listen*. In second grade, we will focus on compassion when we read *Hey, Little Ant*. In third and fourth grade, we will also discuss the importance of compassion and empathy when we read *The Invisible Boy*. I am hoping by the end of October, that I will have small groups running as well. If your child is recommended for a group, I will reach out to let you know more about the group and send home a permission slip for them to participate.

This year at CES, we are going to have a social emotional learning (SEL) topic of the month. These topics will be the focus of the month through daily questions that are read over the announcements and then can be discussed throughout the day. Topics cover a wide range of essential skills like having a growth mindset, conflict resolution, and feelings identification that will help get kids thinking about and discussing how these skills can help them in life. This month, we will focus on **FRIENDSHIP**. Some stories that can be read at home to reinforce the concept of healthy friendships include: <u>Enemy Pie</u> by Derek Munson, <u>The Rainbow Fish</u> by Marcus Pfister, and <u>A Sick Day for Amos McGee</u> by Phillip Stead. Some questions that you can ask your child about friendship include:

- Are you happy with the friendships you have? Why or why not?
- Would you rather have one close friend, or five friends that you are not as close to? Why?
- What do you think makes up a healthy friendship?

CES Reminders, procedures, and expectations

Birthdays

• Store bought food items ONLY can be brought into the school for your child's birthday. No balloons or gift bags please! Students can eat treats, but there will not be individual birthday parties.

Lunches

- Visitors will be able to come to Special Occasion lunches only due to spacing and timing. Invitations will be sent home for these occasions.
- Packed lunches should be from home only. Please do not drop off fast food lunches for your child such as McDonalds.

Holidays and parties

• Holidays and parties may occur throughout the year. These events will be teacher invitation only and may be limited due to spacing.

Absences

- A parent note or doctor note is REQUIRED after your child's absence.
- 10 parent notes per year are accepted as EXCUSED absences.
- After 10 unexcused absences, a mandatory meeting will be held and a plan will be put in place.
- 3 consecutive absences will require a doctor's note excusal.

Change in transportation

• If there is any change in transportation, the request MUST be put in writing prior to 2:00 p.m. otherwise there is no guarantee the change can be made. Coats/Jackets/Lunchboxes/Personal items

• Please write your child's name on all personal items. Each year the lost and found items become overwhelming and unclaimed, which leads to a large donation of unclaimed items.

Bus Lane

• Absolutely NO CARS should enter the bus lane if there is a bus present. Even if there is only 1 bus, we still must maintain the safety of our children and we cannot have vehicles moving through the bus lane.

Communication Tree for student concerns

- To ensure that parental concerns or issues are heard by the appropriate individual who can resolve the issue at the point of origin and provide a direct response, we ask that parents follow the School's Communication Tree outlined below. It is the intent to resolve concerns and issues during the earliest steps with the individual(s) directly involved with the concerns.
 - Step 1) In the event of a concern, a parent should contact the teacher, who is directly involved with the concern or situation.
 - o Step 2) If a parent has completed Step 1 and feels that the issue/concern was not remedied, they should contact the building Principal
 - Please know that when a complaint or concern is shared by a parent with administration regarding an employee, the concern must be shared with that employee.
