AP Exam: Students are expected to take the AP Calculus AB Exam in May. The cost will be around \$91, but

subsidies may be available.

Resources: Students are encouraged to BYOT (bring their own wi-fi accessible technology) daily. *If your child does*

not have access to such technology, please let me know so that I may make other arrangements.

Student Expectations: Calculus is likely to require a substantial investment of time. You should work on calculus every day, regardless of whether or not you have an assignment due. One of the best ways to learn anything is to explain it to someone else. Study groups are encouraged.

Parent Expectations: This is a challenging college-level course, and regular class attendance is essential; likewise, the student must do his or her homework consistently. It is the responsibility of the student to keep up with the presented material. It can become a "mission impossible" to try and makeup neglected work, regardless of the reasons, so please encourage your child to seek help promptly should s/he encounter difficulties. Additionally, students should plan to participate in afterschool practice sessions whenever possible. Some other activities may need to be curtailed in order to make room for calculus during this time.
