

- You will be hearing more about PBIS Positive Behavior Interventions & Support, Social Emotional Learning and Restorative Practices.



## Attendance

A student who enrolls at EXCEL Academy is required to attend school daily. Students withdrawn after 10 consecutive absences.

Parents may provide a note 3 times to excuse the absence. After the 3<sup>rd</sup> parent note, a doctor's note, court order, or official documentation must be submitted for the absence to be excused.

Students should arrive by 8:00 a.m. to not be considered tardy.





## Check–In/Check–Out

#### Must have ID

- Students must have parental permission to leave school early. All students MUST sign out in the front office before leaving the building. Failure to do so may result in removal from EXCEL Academy. Only individuals who are listed on the *Registration Form* and have a picture ID will be allowed to check the child out of school. Please inform us of any changes that need to be made to that list.
- Students must be dropped off at EXCEL Academy by 8:00 a.m. to not be considered tardy and picked up by 4:00 p.m. – no supervision.
- Once students are dropped of by the bus or parents they must remain on campus. They may not leave to go to the store or Huddle House.

EXCEL Academy requires that all students abide by the dress code.




Middle School Students – Yellow or Gold Collared Shirts

## **Dress Code**

- Sweatshirts and jackets are permitted <u>but</u> must have buttons or a zipper in front – Must be able to see collar
- Pullovers/ Hoodies of any kind are not permitted
- Student dress and grooming must be in accordance with health and safety regulations as outlined in the HCS Parent & Student Handbook
- Failure to follow the dress code will result in consequences outlined in the HCS Parent & Student Handbook. Continued failure to follow the dress code may result in the removal from EXCEL Academy.
   Students are expected to comply everyday with the dress code





### **School Safety**

The physical safety of all students and staff is a priority at EXCEL Academy. To minimize the opportunity for offensive or dangerous contraband on campus, the following regulations will be in effect for the school year:

- No book bags, backpacks, duffels, large purses (females may carry a small purse), cases or container
- No sunglasses may be worn during the school day
- Student may only consume water outside the cafeteria in a clear container
- Students may not have stainless steel, thermal or other closed containers. We must be able to see that they have clear liquids.
- Outside food may not be brought to the school unless the parent intends to stay and eat with the student or the parent wants to check the student out to eat and check the student back in school.
- Students must be picked up by 4:00 p.m. each



## **Electronic Devices**

- Students may possess cell phones. However, cell phones should be turned off and out of sight.
- Students may not use cell phones and headsets/headphones/ear
   buds/bluetooths in the cafeteria/hallway.
- Unauthorized use of cell phones or any other electronic devices will result in the student being sent to the front office to turn in the cell phone. Non-compliant students will receive consequences based on the HCS Parent & Student Handbook (See Code of Conduct, Section 1).

### **Student Parking**

- Licensed drivers must complete an application for a student parking permit and submit a payment of \$25 per semester. School personnel may search the vehicles in the parking lot without permission.
- Students with a parking permit are able to park in the designated EXCEL parking spaces. Spaces are limited. Students may not park outside of the area designated for EXCEL students.

### Transportation

- All volunteers (**including students with IEP or 504**) and regular education students assigned to the alternative school by way of a disciplinary hearing must provide their own transportation.
- Students with an IEP or 504 assigned to the alternative school by way of a disciplinary hearing will have transportation provided by HCS.

# Accountability and Exit Plans

- Students entering EXCEL Academy will meet with Student Services several times upon entrance and before exiting.
- The Student Accountability Rubric is used to help students track their academic and behavioral progress while at EXCEL.
- Early return dates are earned opportunities that apply to eligible students only. The chance for an early return is based upon several factors and will be reviewed case-by-case.
