Helpful Hints for Homework

How you can help: Children should read 30 minutes nightly. The ongoing goal is to read a chapter book a week.

How you can help: Review ELA topics with your child. Ask questions about the texts they read in school that day.

How you can help: Ask your child's teacher for assistance with the language in Eureka math. They can direct you to online resources.

walking them inside the classroom. However, if your child is sick with a fever or diarrhea, please keep them home for 24 hours after to prevent the illness spreading to others.

Pygmy Owls- First Grade

Want to help at home with math? Invite your child to show you how to count the Math Way (counting from left to right starting with the pinky of the left hand).

- Play "Math Way" Fingers Flash: Partner A quickly flashes a number (from 1 to 10) the Math Way with his fingers, and then hides them behind his back. Partner B says the number she saw. For a challenge, Partner B tells how many more Partner A needs to make ten.
- Play "Penny Parts": Invite your child to organize a group of 6–10
 pennies into two groups, placing five pennies in one group. Then ask your child to draw a number bond that shows how the pennies are grouped.
 For example, if the total is 8 pennies, then the parts are 5 and 3. For an added challenge, separate the pennies two different ways with the same total, and draw a number bond to match each way; for example, 5 and 3, and 4 and 4.

ਹਰਨ Eagle Owls- Second Grade

Need support with math homework? Here's how you can help support your child at home with Eureka Math:

- If your child would benefit from using concrete objects for support, provide pennies (or other counters) to help him break apart numbers into two parts. The use of fingers is also encouraged!
- Encourage your child to explain how she knows the correct answer. For example, "I know that 10 7 = 3, so that means 10 3 = 7. Three and seven are parts and 10 is the total.
- Practice counting the Say Ten way. Say a two-digit number (e.g., 23 or 37), and ask your child to repeat it the Say Ten way (2 tens 3; 3 tens 7). For fun, invite your child to say some numbers for you to repeat the Say Ten way.

NOTICE TO BUILDING OCCUPANTS AND PARENTS

NOTIFICATION OF INSPECTION FOR ASBESTOS CONTAINING MATERIALS IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has issued a final rule, 40 CFR Part 763, Asbestos Containing Material in schools, commonly referred to as AHERA. This rule requires all Local Education Agencies (LEA's) to identify asbestos containing materials (ACM) in their school buildings and to take appropriate actions to control the release of asbestos fibers.

All inspections for Watergrass Elementary have been completed and a Management Plan describing the results of the inspection and the action plan to control any asbestos found during the inspection, where applicable, has been submitted to the governor for approval. A copy of this plan is located in the administrative office of this school and at the Pasco County Schools Maintenance & Facility Services Department and is available for review upon request.
