<u>Facilities:</u> Our library is nearing completion and almost ready to open its doors. There are two items we are waiting on:

- fire alarm to pass inspection
- networking to be completed

Regarding facilities, one item I am happy to share is the recent funding of a new project slated for 2014 - 2015 SY. We received funding from our legislature to fund a bridge that connects the 2nd story of our D and E buildings with an elevator for ADA access. This will help us better manage our resources such as computer labs and make them more accessible for all students. Preliminary conversations have started but work is not slated to start until the summer of 2015! Keeping you all posted!

<u>Curriculum</u>: Hawaii has adopted a common progam statewide to address math and language arts curriculum. This is in the effort to provide an education that meets the changing demands of the world. Waimalu began working on the new standards of education in 2010-2011 school year. So while the state tests are measuring the "old set" of skills, Waimalu has begun working on the "new set" of skills. This is so we can be ahead of the game instead of trying to play catch up.

We are continuing this effort for 2014 - 2015 SY:

"Wonders" English/Language Arts curriculum is mandated for elementary schools for 2015 - 2016 school year. Waimalu will begin implementation in 2014 - 2015 school year.

State has just announced a new math program for all elementary schools. Implementation date is tentatively set for 2015 - 2016 school year. Waimalu will begin implementing this program in 2014 - 2015 school year for grades K-2. The program is called "Stepping Stones". The other grades will be continuing with their existing programs: Investigations for grades 3-5, Envision for grade 6.

Waimalu is excited to take on the new curriculum! This is a reflection of our teachers being innovators and trailblazers in setting the bar!

That'll wrap it up for May's message. Friendly Reminder: First day of school for students start on Friday August 1st. We will be hosting our annual "Meet and Greet" night on Wednesday, July 30th. We look forward to seeing all of you back in the new school year! Also looking forward to seeing fresh faces with our kindergarten classes! Enjoy your summer and catch up on some R&R!

Office News

The first day of school for next school year is Friday, August 1, 2014. Class lists will be posted Friday, July 25 after 9:00 am. A class supply list and school calendar will be included with your child's report card.

"Report Cards will be held Hostage" for any outstanding obligations. If your child has any outstanding obligations such as lost book fees, library books or lunch loans, they will not receive their report card on the last day of school. Those report cards "held hostage" will be available for parent pick up in school office. The office is open all summer!
