- Strong SAT/ACT Scores: UF avg SAT 1340-1470; FSU avg SAT 1270-1390; UNF – avg SAT 1200-1320
- Strong Personal Portfolio: Involvement in school and community, sports, ROTC, band, community service.

COURSE SELECTION

- MRS. KUNZE MADE ALL RECOMMENDATIONS FOR COURSES BASED ON PAST FSA ELA SCORES AND COURSE GRADES.
- CHANGES CAN BE MADE TO COURSE RECOMMENDATIONS THROUGH A <u>STUDENT PETITION PROCESS</u>.
- WE WILL REVIEW PETITIONS TO MAKE DECISIONS IN JUNE WHEN WE HAVE 8TH GRADE FSA SCORES AND FINAL COURSE GRADES TO REVIEW.

DISTRICT HONORS CRITERIA

- GRADES A GRADE OF "C" OR BETTER IN THE PREVIOUS HONORS COURSE. STUDENTS EARNING A GRADE OF "A" IN THE PREVIOUS STANDARD COURSE MAY BE RECOMMENDED FOR HONORS COURSE PLACEMENT.
- FSA LEVEL 4 OR 5 IN APPROPRIATE AREA AND NOT LESS THAN A LEVEL 3 IN ANY AREA

DROPPING AN AP OR HONORS COURSE

- COURSES CAN ONLY BE DROPPED AT THE SEMESTER IF...
 - STUDENT HAS A "D" OR AN "F"
 - STUDENT HAS CONSISTENTLY ATTENDED HELP SESSIONS
 - PARENT AND STUDENT HAVE HAD A CONFERENCE EACH QUARTER WITH THE TEACHER
- THERE MUST BE A SEAT AVAILABLE IN THE DESIRED COURSE.

GRADE FORGIVENESS

- IF HS COURSE IS TAKEN IN MIDDLE SCHOOL A GRADE OF "C" OR BELOW CAN BE REPLACED. IF CURRENT GRADES FOR ALGEBRA HONORS OR GEOMETRY HONORS WERE LOW, CHILD WAS RECOMMENDED TO REPEAT.
- IN HIGH SCHOOL <u>ONLY</u> A GRADE OF "D" OR "F" CAN BE REPLACED. STUDENT MUST EARN A "C" OR HIGHER WHEN REPEATING TO REPLACE THE "D" OR "F." IF ANOTHER "D" OR "F" IS EARNED THE 2ND TIME, <u>BOTH</u> GRADES WILL COUNT IN GPA CALCULATION.

SPANISH

- BEGINNING AND INTERMEDIATE SPANISH ARE EQUIVALENT TO SPANISH 1. IF GRADES IN THE TWO COURSES WERE NOT 95 OR HIGHER, THEN STUDENTS WERE NOT RECOMMENDED FOR SPANISH 2.
- STUDENTS MUST BE RECOMMENDED FOR ENGLISH 1 HONORS TO TAKE A WORLD LANGUAGE IN 9TH GRADE.
- 2 CONSECUTIVE YEARS OF A WORLD LANGUAGE ARE ONLY REQUIRED FOR FL BRIGHT FUTURES AND ADMISSION TO A 4-YEAR UNIVERSITY.

INTENSIVE READING

- INTENSIVE READING IS NOT OFFERED AS A STAND ALONE COURSE TO UNDERCLASSMEN.
- 7TH GRADE FSA ELA SCORES WERE USED FOR RECOMMENDATIONS. WE WILL REVIEW PLACEMENT ONCE WE HAVE 8TH GRADE SCORES IN JUNE.
- FOR 9TH & 10TH GRADERS WITH FSA ELA OF LEVEL 1 OR 2, A READING COURSE WILL BE PAIRED WITH CONTENT COURSES FOR A 90MIN DAILY COURSE.
 - 9TH WORLD HISTORY & READING 1 (90MIN CLASS EVERY DAY)
 - 10TH BIOLOGY & READING 2 (90MIN CLASS EVERY DAY)

INTENSIVE MATH

- IF 7TH GRADE FSA MATH SCORE IS A LEVEL 1 OR 2, STUDENTS WERE PLACED IN BLOCKED ALGEBRA – 90 MINS OF ALGEBRA EVERY DAY.
- PLACEMENT IN BLOCKED ALGEBRA WILL BE REVIEWED IN JUNE ONCE WE RECEIVE 8TH GRADE FSA MATH SCORES.
