# DISTRICT HONORS CRITERIA

- **GRADES - A GRADE OF C OR BETTER IN THE PREVIOUS HONORS COURSE.** STUDENTS EARNING A GRADE OF A IN THE PREVIOUS STANDARD COURSE MAY BE RECOMMENDED FOR HONORS COURSE PLACEMENT.
- **FSA - LEVEL 4 OR 5** IN APPROPRIATE AREA AND NOT LESS THAN A LEVEL 3 IN ANY AREA



# DROPPING AN AP OR HONORS COURSE

- COURSES CAN ONLY BE DROPPED AT THE SEMESTER IF...
  - STUDENT HAS A “D” OR AN “F”
  - STUDENT HAS CONSISTENTLY ATTENDED HELP SESSIONS (EXCEL TIME)
  - PARENT AND STUDENT HAVE HAD A CONFERENCE EACH QUARTER WITH THE TEACHER
- THERE MUST BE A SEAT AVAILABLE IN THE DESIRED COURSE.

# GRADE FORGIVENESS

- IN HIGH SCHOOL ONLY A GRADE OF “D” OR “F” CAN BE REPLACED.
- IF THERE IS A COURSE THAT NEEDS TO BE REPEATED, PLEASE ADD TO THE STUDENT VERIFICATION REQUEST.

- THE CANDIDATE MUST REGISTER FOR 3 HL EXAMS YOUR SENIOR YEAR. YOU MAY TAKE UP TO 4 HL EXAMS.

# TO EARN THE IB DIPLOMA:

- THE CANDIDATE MUST EARN AT LEAST 24 POINTS OR MORE.
- THERE IS NO GRADE 1 AWARDED IN A SUBJECT/LEVEL.
- THERE ARE NO MORE THAN TWO GRADE 2S AWARDED (HL OR SL).
- THERE ARE NO MORE THAN THREE GRADE 3S OR BELOW AWARDED (HL OR SL).
- THE CANDIDATE HAS GAINED 12 POINTS OR MORE ON HL SUBJECTS (IF YOU TAKE FOR 4 HL SUBJECTS, THE THREE HIGHEST GRADES COUNT).
- THE CANDIDATE HAS GAINED 9 POINTS OR MORE ON SL SUBJECTS (CANDIDATES WHO REGISTER FOR TWO SL SUBJECTS MUST GAIN AT LEAST 5 POINTS AT SL).

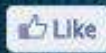
