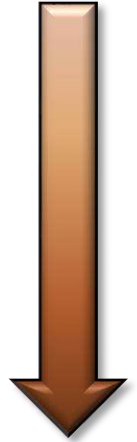

Interjections

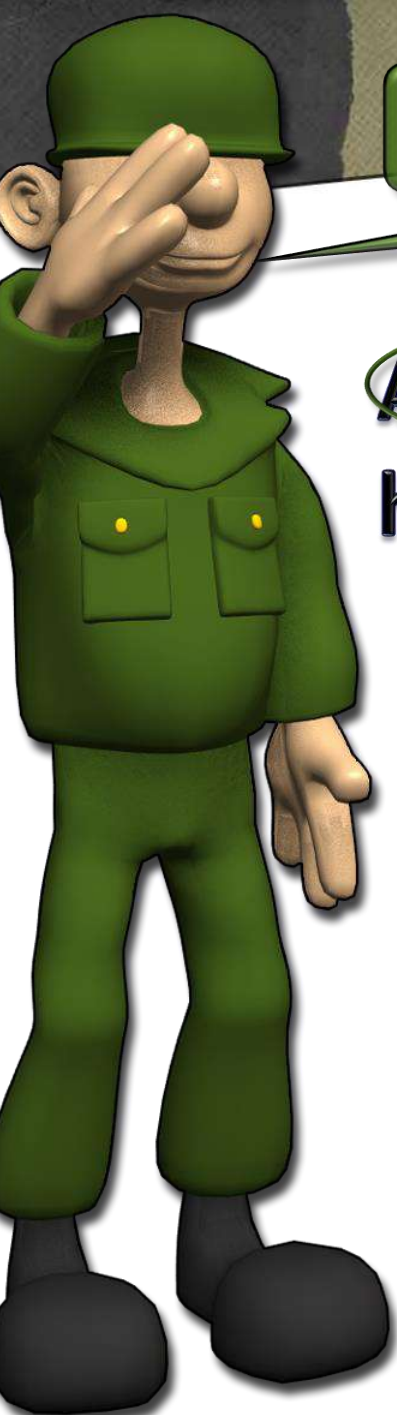
Interjections are expressive words.
