



- Get into the college of your choice: AP Courses enhance a student's academic transcript, offering better opportunities for college admissions.
- Develop skills that lead to success in college: AP Courses require higher level critical thinking skills.
- <u>Save money</u>: Many colleges award credit for passing scores on AP exams.
- Finish college sooner: Students who receive course credit for AP exam scores may finish college earlier or may be able to take additional college courses.




Seal of Biliteracy:

- 1 ELA GPA of 3.0 or better
- AP World Language Exam with a score of 4 or higher 1 OR
- 1 IB World Language Exam (SL and HL only, not ab initio) with a score of 5 or higher or if an AP or IB World Language course in the target language is not offered at the school:


International Skills Diploma:

- At least three credits in the same world language
- ✓ At least four credits in International Focus courses (see approved IF course list from DOE)
- At least four extracurricular activities and experiences with global themes and/or in global contexts (e.g. exchange) programs, international and language clubs, travel abroad, etc.)
- At least twenty hours of community service involving a global/cross-cultural public service project
- Capstone presentation on the knowledge gained in the courses and activities





- Students can earn multiple seals for their diploma
- Students can qualify for multiple medallions
 - Only one Medallion Issued

 - Only one area of advanced academic recognition
