## **Gifted Creativity PBL Project Question Guide**

Where can I find the PBL Projects? The links to the projects can be found on my website under Differentiated Learning Projects. I will also provide a link to the projects on the Google Classroom Stream.

Why am I doing this? I want to make sure that my gifted students are challenging themselves, using their talents, piquing their interests, and learning new things...just like they would in the normal gifted classroom.

When should I do this? The choice is yours.

When is my PBL project due? The projects are expected to take you no longer than two weeks to complete. However, if a student finds that it is taking longer than two weeks to complete their project, I will be flexible with the deadline. The student will just need to stay in communication with me about how their project is progressing.

**How will you know how I am doing on my project?** I will require that you check in with me twice a week if you choose to work on a project. You will provide me a paragraph of your progress twice a week.

What do I do if I have a question about the PBL Project? You can send me a private message on the PBL project assignment link in the Google Classroom if you have questions regarding the project, or you can email me at mgreer@henry.k12.ga.us

**Is there a particular way that I need to present my project?** The answer is NO. This is where your creativity comes in. The project is open to your own interpretation (You don't have to follow the direct guidelines given in the PBL prompt.). You may use whatever medium you choose to complete and turn in your project. Suggested formats for all PBLs are provided on the next page.

How will I know if I am doing my PBL project correctly? There is no right or wrong way to do this project. However, you are a gifted student and you are expected to design a project that is in line with your abilities. Your work should not be rushed, simple, or sloppy. I should be able to tell that you put in the time and creativity to provide a quality product.

**Is there a rubric that I can use as a guide?** The rubrics can be found on my website under Differentiated Learning Projects.

If I am using technology (Google Apps), can I work with another student on this project? Unfortunately, I feel that it might create issues if you are working with others on this assignment during remote learning, so the answer will have to be no. Sorry.

## How do I turn my project in?

- Share Google Documents or Google Slides with me or send your finished project as an attachment to my email
- Take a picture of your project and/or what you have completed, attach it (along with a written description) and send it to my email
- Make a video of your presentation/record yourself presenting and send the completed project to my email
