2024 Summer School Registration Information

Purpose: Pearl City High School Summer School offers courses to meet the particular needs of students in areas such as acceleration, enrichment, review, and remediation. Summer School is free this year for students that were enrolled in a HIDOE or charter school during 2023-2024. For non-HIDOE students, 0.5 credit \$95 and 1.0 credit \$190.

It is strongly recommended that students **DO NOT** take courses for advancement due to the accelerated academic pace of summer school. Students may take courses to review for the upcoming school year. If summer school is used to repeat a class, the higher grade will replace a lower grade.

Registration for ALL students will continue every Friday from 3:00 PM - 4:00 PM in A102.

Wait List: Once a class is full, we will place your child on a waitlist. Please do not call the summer school office on your status. We will call and notify you.

Attendance and Discipline Policy: See Pearl City High School Discipline and Attendance Guide (Attachment). Please review with your child and the registration form (required for registration).

Computer and Internet Access: The school library is closed during the summer. If students need access to computers, they may go to the summer school office before school from 7:30am to 7:55am, recess, and after school from 1:00 PM to 2:00 PM. If students need to print or make copies, there will be a \$0.25 charge per page. (black and white only)

End-of-Course (EOC) Exam: Students that are taking Biology are required to take an EOC exam by the state. The EOC could be 15% of the year grade, this will be up to the course teacher. The leadership team of PCHS has come up with a scale to convert the EOC score to a percentage. This is the same scale that summer school will use to calculate the student's grade for the EOC and year.

Summer School Room Assignments: Posted May 30, 2024 by K201, B205, and C207.

Break and Snack: A 15 minute break will be at 10:30 –10:45 AM. Snacks may be purchased at designated sites during the breaks. Designated sites will be announced on the first day of classes.

Academic Information: Letter grades (A-F) will be used for student evaluation for all courses. The summer school grade will be recorded as part of the student's permanent transcript and included in the overall grade point average calculation. Credits are granted according to the number of hours enrolled.

Report Cards: Report Cards will be issued at the end of each course. Students are responsible for sharing the report card with their parents. EXCEPTION: Report Cards for classes that are required to take the EOC Exam **may** be mailed home once their score is received and calculated with their grade.

Course Cancellation: Should enrollment not meet the required number to warrant the course or an additional section, the course or section may be canceled and students given a full refund. The lack of a qualified teacher may also result in the cancellation of a course with full refund.

Instructions for Registration

- 1. Check with your counselor/teacher for course approval/selection. It is the responsibility of the student/parent to ensure that they register for the correct course. Summer school will not verify your course selection.
- 2. Complete the registration card.
- 3. Register with on your assigned day. **Please show your school ID.**
- 4. If you are wait-listed, PCHS Summer School will contact you when you are accepted into the class. Please do not call the summer school office on your status. We will call and notify you.

First Day Information

- 1. Class listings will be posted outside K201, B205, and C207.
- 2. Students must be prepared for classes by bringing necessary materials and supplies (e.g. folder, folder paper, pen/pencil, etc). PE students should dress in t-shirts and shorts for activities and bring water (not soft drink/juice).
- 3. Students are reminded to stay away from all construction and off limit areas before school, AM break, and after school.
- 4. For security reasons, student parking will be allowed only by the gym. Students are not allowed to park in parking lots closest to the building (teachers and summer school staff only). Summer school will not be responsible for any damages to student vehicles.

PE Information

- 1. If you have a medical condition, it is not recommended that you take PE in the summer. Please consider taking the course during the school year.

Percussion Course Information

Students in the Percussion Class will learn the basic fundamentals of drumming and notation reading. Basic notation will
cover the note tree all the way to 16th and triplet note rolls. Students will also go over Concert Percussion, Marching
Percussion, and Drum Set playing for Jazz Band if time permits. Students are expected to enroll in Band during the
regular school year.
