COMMUNITY:

Pearl City is a suburban community comprised of 51,078 residents. Although considered middle class, the community has a full spectrum of military and local residents coming from all socio-economic levels. The median household income in Pearl City is \$91,122, while the state stands at \$81,284.

OUR SCHOOL:

Pearl City High School (PCHS), home of the Chargers, was established in 1971. PCHS is a public school located on the slopes of the Ko'olau Mountain range and overlooks historic Pearl Harbor. The primary feeder school is Highlands Intermediate School, which receives its students from eight area elementary schools. As of August 2019, PCHS has an approximate enrollment of 1,545 students in grades 9 through 12. The student population is ethnically diverse. The dominant ethnic groups are Asian (55.3%), Pacific Islander (26.7%), White (8.1%), Hispanic (2.7%), and Black (2.3%)

The 2018-2019 school year has brought exciting changes to our school structure. PCHS is beginning to implement the academy model. There are 3 academies established for students from grade 9-12. The academies are as follows: Academy of International Business and Design, Academy of Technology and Design, Academy of Culinary Arts, Health Science and Leadership. Each academy has a designated academy principal and a designated counselor.

Students must register for seven periods per semester, with a semester lasting approximately 18 weeks. Each class meets for approximately 70 minutes, 3 times a week. Study Hall is available to all students, 3 days per week. Credits for courses are awarded at the end of the semester and at the end of each year.
