What is Title I?

Colquitt County High School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support state and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging state academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement plan.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Colquitt County High School will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. CCHS values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish and equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. How is it developed?

We also distribute an annual survey online and at the school to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year including any parent events hosted at the school.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A School-Wide program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participated in the opportunities described in this plan. Colquitt County High School will provide full opportunities for participation of parents with limited English, parents of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the student handbook that is given to all students. As a reminder, we will send a Remind.com text to all parents in August before the scheduled Open House event. The plan will also be posted on the school website and social media. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center/Area located in the Main Lobby.

2021-2022 District Goals

- By the end of the 2021-2022 school year, CCCS will increase the percentage of students at levels 3 & 4 on state testing for each tested subject by 3% for each subgroup to approach state average.
- By the end of the 2021-2022 school year, the CCCS will decrease of discipline outcomes that remove students from the learning environment by 3% through increased student service support and interventions.

2021-2022 School Goals

- The percentage of students passing Geometry for the 2020-2021 24 week grading period will increase by 3%.
- The percentage of students scoring as Proficient Learners and above will increase by 3% on the 2021 American Lit GMAS EOC.
