We were fortunate on Friday of last week to have a visiting team of HCS educators to complete a Personalized Learning site visit. The purpose of the visit was to give us some input on our progress with our Personalized Learning initiative. All PL schools are receiving site visits. We'll use the results and commentary to help shape our future plans and work.

SCHOOL SECURITY AND RELATED TOPICS:

We had a good week in The Lion's Den. As Pride News last week indicated, we were going to engage in conversations about school security and related topics. I did have good conversations with our faculty, School Council and our students from the Principal Council. And, received input about both how to secure the safety of our building and how to continue to improve building effective relationships to make sure that all students feel that they have a place in our school.

This was the first phase in our work. We'll be making some initial changes to some of our procedures this week, then continue talking and working on how to make progress on our 2 initiatives. We know that the security and safety of everyone at Luella High School is our most important priority. I will certainly keep you updated as our work continues.

Let me ask for your help by reminding you that all school visitors, including: parents, former students, or any visitor, should enter only through the main school entrance and report only to either the front office or attendance office.
