ANNUAL MILITARY INSPECTION (AMI):

The annual inspection for our NJROTC unit will occur on Wednesday, October 25. The inspection is a day long process conducted by Naval and/or Marine officers that assess how effective our unit is preparing cadets to be lifelong, participatory citizens. The assessment includes a review of academics, military inspection, community service, participation and success by the multiple competitive ROTC teams that our unit fields. A great deal of preparations have occurred to get our unit ready.

ONE-ACT PLAY:

SCHOOL RENOVATIONS AND NEW CONSTRUCTION:

100 Hall classes have now had 1 week in the mobile classrooms, and other than a small hiccup on Monday that I sent an email out about last week, students and teachers have made the transition, and classes are continuing. 100 Hall renovations should be completed in December, and 100 Hall classes will be moved back into the building during the Holiday Break.

Renovations to convert the former auto mechanics lab into classrooms for our Law and Justice classes and for next year's Broadcast Video classes continue.

Grading work has begun in the back of the building to ready the sites for the auxiliary gym and new fine arts spaces.

PRE-ACT:

On Wednesday, November 1, we'll administer the Pre-ACT. 10th grade students automatically take the Pre-ACT and are paid for by the State.

As an important practice test for the ACT, 9th grade students may take the test to learn what the test will cover and to determine which courses they need to take in the next two years to prepare for the College Entrance Exam (ACT) in the 11th and 12th grades.

Registration and payment for the Pre-ACT can be made through the link on our website: Under Site Shortcuts – use Pay for Pre-ACT. The cost of the test is \$17.00. Students must also complete the online form and return it to the Front Office by Friday October 27, 2017. Registration is first come, first serve.

BLOOD DRIVE:

The Luella HOSA club will host a blood drive for Luella students and the public on Friday, October 27 from 8:30 - 1:30 in the lobby of the gymnasium. The public is invited to come by and give blood.

ACT:

We'll administer the ACT at Luella on Saturday, October 28. Pre-registration is required.
