## **Buy American Provision**

- Added to the National School Lunch Act by Section 104(d) of the William F. Goodling Child Nutrition Reauthorization Act of 1998 (Public Law 105-786)
- Domestic commodity or product
  - An agricultural commodity or product that is produced or processed in the United States using substantial agricultural commodities that are produced in the United States.



## **Buy American Provision**

#### Substantial

 Over 51 % of the final processed product must consist of agricultural commodities that were grown domestically

#### Applies to SFAs

 Purchasing commercial products for use in School Nutrition Programs



## **Buy American Provision**

#### **Unprocessed Foods**

For foods that are unprocessed, the agricultural commodities must be domestic

#### **Processed Foods**

 For foods that are processed, they must be processed domestically using domestic agricultural food components that are comprised of over 51% domestically grown items, by weight or volume



## School Nutrition Funds

#### Funds in food service account include:

- Federal Funds
- Payment for meals
- Sales of competitive foods
- Other



## Complying with Buy American

- Use Buy American Provision language
  - Product specifications
  - Bid solicitations
    - Invitation for Bid
    - Request for Proposal
  - Contracts
- Require suppliers to attest that their final food products are either 100% domestic commodities or a processed food product containing over 51% domestic food components
- Check products at time of delivery
- Monitor contractor performance



## Complying with Buy American

#### Additional Formal Procurement Language Should Include:

- The need for documentation that requests consideration on the use of domestic alternative foods before approving an exception
- A requirement to document the use of a non-domestic food exception when competition reveals the cost of domestic food is significantly higher than non-domestic food
- A requirement to document the use of a non-domestic alternative food due to the domestic food not being produced or manufactured in sufficient and reasonable available quantities of a satisfactory quality



## Exceptions to Buy American

There are two exceptions to the Buy American Provision:

- The food or food product is not produced or manufactured in the United States in sufficient and reasonably available quantities of a satisfactory quality
- Competitive bids reveal the cost of a United States food or food product is significantly higher than the nondomestic product

Note: It is up to each individual School Food Authority to determine if a domestic food item meets one of these two exceptions. SFAs must keep documentation justifying their use of the exception prior to purchase of the product.



#### **USDA** Foods

#### **USDA** Foods

- Are domestic
- Processed end products that contain USDA foods need to meet the 51% domestic requirement
