^{*} DDOE requires SFAs who contract with Food Service Management Companies or Pre-Plated Meal Vendors to use DDOE templates for procurement. The completed templates must be returned to DDOE prior to public advertisement. SFAs who conduct procurement on their own for prime vendors, paper goods, etc. are not required to submit IFBs/RFPs to DDOE for review prior to soliciting. However, all State of Delaware and USDA procurement regulations must be followed.
