- Data set includes 903 students who were at New Trier for 4 years
- 978 graduates in the Class of 2022



Course-Taking Patterns: Core Academics

- Recommend 4 to 5 core academics per year
- 65% of students took 19 or more core academic courses
 5.4% increase compared to 2021
- 14.6% of students took more than 20 core academic courses
 3% increase compared to 2021
- Class of 2023 trended toward 19 or more core academic courses



Course-Taking Patterns: Elective Courses

- Elective enrollment increase slightly over the class of 2021
 - 62.2% of students took between 2 and 4 elective courses compared to 59.6% in 2021
- More than one-quarter of class to more than one elective per year
- 92.4% of freshmen took an elective
 - Slight decline from 94%, after trending up over last two years

College Matriculation

Trends in College Applications and Admissions

- Demand was greater than supply at highly selective colleges and universities
- Increase in number of applications and test-optional schools
 - NT: 8.2 applications/students
 - NT: 35% applied test optional to one or more schools
- Across the board, college acceptance rates and matriculation rates similar to previous years
- **PHSC** knowledge, expertise, experience of the landscape
 - continue to build relationships with colleges and universities
 - Educate students and families to make informed decisions
