7th Grade Girls are on the Move ... College Bound What's Going On In 7th Grade Classes?

Are you wondering what your child in learning in class?

Well here is the scoop ...

Ms. Miles and Mrs. Wells classes have recently finished their Expository unit, learning common text features of informational writing and engaging in webbased research. Students created their own magazines called The Informed Traveler, where their issues featured a country they selected. This week, we have entered into the Persuasive Unit. Students are discussing propaganda strategies evident in commercials and ad and analyzing the target audience. In the coming weeks, students will focus on persuasive strategies in writing, readying them for the Georgia Middle Grades Writing Assessment. The culminating task in this unit will require students to create their own advertisements and construct a persuasive essay.

Mr. Najm and Mr. Jones mathematics classes students are currently working in Unit 3. In this unit, students will explore positive and negative numbers and extend many previously learned number and operations concepts to include the use of all rational numbers (natural numbers, whole numbers, integers and other rational numbers.) Students will also solve problems by defining

variables, writing and solving one -step and two-step equations, and interpreting the solution of the equations in the context of the original problem. In Grade 6 Mathematics, students studied one-step equations with positive rational numbers.
