# What's Going On In 8th Grade?

### English Language Arts

#### Ms. Garner & Ms. James

The unit we are currently working on is Expository Writing. This unit focuses on the informational texts and your daughter has begun the process of researching a topic to create her own expository text. Some of the girls chose to work independently, while others decided to work in groups of two or three. They will soon begin the process of actually writing their papers. The final products are due on November 04, 2011.

Additionally, we are reading a class novel. On Team A, we are reading I am the Cheese by Robert Cormier. They have recorded specific pages and activities that should be completed in their agendas.

We will soon begin Unit 3 which will focus on persuasive texts and review GPS that have been previously presented. Your daughters will be writing several papers during this unit in preparation for the Middle Grades Writing Assessment.

Our novel focus for this unit will be <u>The Diary of Anne Frank</u>. This is a memoir written by a young girl who was a part of the holocaust. The girls will need to purchase at any book story or check this book out in the community library.

unit also discusses Georgia's role during the American Revolution. Upon completion of the unit, students will take a post benchmark test. Ms. Melton, my student teacher candidate, is preparing to teach the students about slavery during several lessons.

She has already administered a pre- test to assess what prior knowledge students already have on the topic, so that she can plan her lessons accordingly. She will begin those lessons during the last week of Oct. thru the first week of November.

We are also in the process of finalizing two field trips to the Dahlonega gold mine and the Atlanta History Center to experience the interactive Civil War exhibit.

Students are also working on Social Studies Fair Projects.
