
- 1. In the blue Lit book on pages 56-57, read about Edgar Allan Poe and "The Cask of Amontillado."

When you read a word that prevents you from understanding Poe's meaning, STOP, LOOK IT UP and WRITE DOWN the word and the meaning that applies in Poe's context. (Be aware that you'll find many words defined at the bottom of pages in the Lit text!) If you need more space than the lines below, use notebook paper.
