All requirements are completed while in high school (GPA, SAT/ACT test scores and volunteer hours). See attached document to help you complete this application process.

## Save the Date

The **SAT** will be given to all 11th grade students on Wednesday, March 2 during the school day. Students can set up a College Board account at [www.collegeboard.org](http://www.collegeboard.org) and can link their account to Khan Academy where they have access to official SAT practice items.

The **ACT** will be given to all 11th grade students on Tuesday, March 29 during the school day.

All students, including students taking any classes on SCVS, will automatically be signed up to take the above assessments. Students do not need to register and there will be no charge.
