

WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY

Saturday, October 10th was World Mental Health Day, and it served as an important reminder that the mental health of our children is just as important as their physical health. With concerns over the COVID-19 pandemic, and many students learning from home, we are more concerned than ever about the mental health and well-being of our students.

Beginning this week, our teachers will present short lessons on topics related to mental health every Monday and Tuesday. These lessons are now required by the Florida Department of Education, and they are intended to expand student knowledge, help them learn how to respond to family or friends who experience challenges, and learn to recognize when they are experiencing their own mental health challenges.

A critical component of these lessons is realizing that help is available on our campus. LMHS staffs both a mental health counselor and a social worker on our campus who offer free resources to students, and our Student Services team are also trained to assist students in need. Contact info is provided in this newsletter, and we hope you will take advantage of our resources, if needed.

Connect and Save my Seat students should arrive on the testing day by 7:20am and the student testing locations list will be posted outside Student Services. FSA/ELA READING/WRITING RETAKES

Due to COVID-19, 10th grade students during the 2019-2020 school year did not have the opportunity to participate in the spring administration of this assessment. Students are required to meet reading high school graduation requirements through this assessment. Students may also utilize any of the following options to meet the FSA ELA high school graduation requirement:

Earn a level 3 on the FSA ELA retake during ANY future administration (offered twice a year - October/November or February/March)

Earn/use a concordant score on one of the following assessments:


- SAT ERW Score of 430+ (grade 12 students will take SAT on Wednesday, October 14)
- SAT ERW Score of 480+ (grade 9-11 students
 11th Grade will take SAT in April)
- ACT an average score of 18 on English and Reading Subtests
