ACT School Day

The ACT will be given to all 11th grade students on Tuesday, October 5 during the school day. Any 12th grade student who has not yet met the reading and/or math graduation requirement will be scheduled to take the non-college reportable ACT for a concordant score. This information has been emailed to student and parents.

Testing will begin at 7:20am and will finish at approximately 12:00pm. All students who are testing will go to 2nd lunch at 11:56am. There will be no make-ups for the ACT.

Students should bring pencils and a calculator. Calculators will not be provided. The ACT Calculator Policy is attached to this email.

PSAT NMSQT

The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT NMSQT) will be given at Lake Mary High School on Wednesday, October 13th to all 9th, 10th and 11th grade students. For juniors, the PSAT is the only avenue to the National Merit Scholarship Program. For sophomores and freshmen, PSAT scores are used to qualify for registration in some Advanced Placement courses. All students will take the PSAT free of charge and there will not be any make-ups. Students do not need to register for this.

Students should bring pencils and a calculator. Calculators will not be provided. The PSAT Calculator Policy is attached to this email.

SAT

The SAT will be given to all 12th grade students on Wednesday, October 13 during the school day. Students can set up a College Board account at www.collegeboard.org and can link their account to Khan Academy where they have access to official SAT practice items. 12th grade students will take the SAT free of charge and there will not be any make-ups. Students do not need to register for this.

Students should bring pencils and a calculator. Calculators will not be provided. The SAT Calculator Policy is attached to this email.

Any students who have been approved for accommodations through College Board (for SAT and PSAT) will be sent an email about a week before the testing date with this information.

Next week, students and parents will receive an email with the student testing room for October 13 testing. This information will also be emailed to all teachers and will be posted outside Media.

FSA ELA Writing/Reading, Algebra EOC, and Geometry EOC Retake Results

The results from the Retake Administration that took place over the past few weeks will be as follows:

FSA/ELA Writing/Reading (meets reading graduation requirement) – Results available end of December.

Students may utilize any of the following options to meet the FSA ELA high school graduation requirement:

- Earn a level 3 (score of 350) on the 10th Grade FSA ELA (writing and reading combined)
- Earn/use a concordant score on one of the following assessments:
- 1.SAT ERW Score of 480+
- 2.ACT average score of 18 on English and Reading Subtests

Algebra and Geometry EOC (meets math graduation requirement) – Results available end of November/December.

Students may utilize any of the following options to meet the Math high school graduation requirement:

- Earn a level 3 (score of 497) on the Algebra 1 EOC or
- Earn a level 3 (score of 499) on the Geometry EOC score or
- Earn/use a concordant score on one of the following assessments:
- 1.PSAT/NMSQT Math Score of 430+
- 2.SAT Math Score of 420+
- 3.ACT Math Score of 16+

If any students who are new to Lake Mary High School have concordant SAT (SAT ERW score of 480+) or ACT (average of 18 on English and Reading Subtests) scores, please email kathleen_aslin@scps.us with the score report.

National SAT/ACT Testing Dates

Students can register through College Board (<u>www.collegeboard.com</u>) and ACT (<u>www.act.org</u>) to take these tests on a Saturday National Testing Date. SAT – November 6, December 4, March 12, May 7, and June 4 ACT – October 23, December 11, February 12, April 2, June 11, July 16
