As most of you know, LMHS recently had a virtual visit from an accreditation team after having spent the past year preparing for the visit. A number of students, parents, community partners, school and district staff participated in interviews with the evaluators. Further, the evaluators reviewed all of the write-ups and evidence teams of school stakeholders gathered for their review. Today, I received their report from the visitation committee, which included rankings for each indicator, a final score, commendations and recommendations. I am very proud to report that LMHS had a final score of 350, and to put that in perspective, the average score of schools like ours over the past five years lie in a range from 278-283. Some of the commendations include student engagement, as well as parent and community involvement. Thank you to all of the parents and partners who stay involved in LMHS to make RamNation a safe, supportive, and spirited learning environment. Go Rams! -Dr. Reynolds

This application lets the state of Florida know you are graduating this year. It is recommended that you use your Social Security number. This application should take only 15 minutes to complete at the most. YOU DO NOT NEED ALL THE REQUIREMENTS MET BEFORE YOU APPLY. APPLY TODAY! All requirements are completed while in high school (GPA, SAT/ACT test scores and volunteer hours). See attached document to help you complete this application process.

Testing Update

SAT School Day - Wednesday, March 2

The SAT will be given to all 11th grade students on Wednesday, March 2 during the school day. 11th grade students will take the SAT free of charge and there will not be any make-ups. Students do not need to register for this.

Students should bring pencils and a calculator. Calculators will not be provided. The SAT Calculator Policy is attached to his email.

Class of 2022 – Testing Graduation Requirements Updated by State Board

*The Florida State Board has updated rule 6A-1.09422 to delay the implementation of the new concordant and comparative scores aligned to the Florida Standards by one year, allowing the graduating class of 2021-22 (entered grade 9 in 18-19) to use as many options for meeting their assessment graduation requirements as possible.

What does this mean?

Class of 2022 can have the following to meet testing graduation requirements:

Reading: SAT ERW: 430+ (changed from 480). SAT Reading: 24 (new). ACT average of 18 on English and Reading subtests. ACT Reading: 19 (new). 10th FSA/ELA: 350.

Math: SAT Math: 420. PSAT/NMSQT: 430. ACT Math: 16. FSA Geometry EOC: 499. PERT Math: 97 (new). Algebra 1 EOC: 497.

National SAT/ACT Testing Dates

Students can register through College Board (www.collegeboard.com) and ACT (www.act.org) to take these tests on a Saturday National Testing Date.

SAT – May 7, and June 4

ACT – April 2, June 11, July 16

Testing Update, cont'd

Algebra 1 EOC Math Graduation Requirement

Algebra 1 EOC retake testing will take place on March 3 (Session 1) and March 4 (Session 2). 11th and 12th grade students who have not yet met the math graduation requirement will be scheduled to take the Algebra 1 EOC.

Students (Class 2023-2025) may utilize any of the following options to meet the Math high school graduation requirement:

- Earn a level 3 (score of 497) on the Algebra 1 EOC or
- Earn a level 3 (score of 499) on the Geometry EOC score or
- Earn/use a comparative score on one of the following assessments:
 1. PSAT/NMSQT Math Score of 430+
 2. SAT Math Score of 420+
 3. ACT Math Score of 16+

If any students have concordant math scores from previous assessments taken, please email kathleen_aslin@scps.us with the score report. More information will be sent out soon to those students who will be scheduled to test.
