

No passes will be accepted or students allowed in free to post-season events held at Lake Mary High School. The only passes accepted for the post-season are FHSAA State Series Passes.


#### Reminder

## **FSA ELA Writing Assessment**

All 9th and 10th grade students were scheduled to take the FSA ELA Writing recently. Per the Florida Department of Education (FDOE), no remote administrations are available for any statewide summative assessments.

Make-ups for the FSA Writing will continue this week in Media for Face to Face Students. Any Connect or Save My Seat students that have not yet taken the FSA Writing can come to Media on Tuesday (11:00am), Wednesday (10:30am), or Thursday (11:00am). This assessment is 120 minutes.

## FSA ELA Reading Assessments-Grades 9/10

9th Grade FSA ELA Reading will be given on **Thursday, May 6** (Session 1 – 90 minutes) and **Friday, May 7** (Session 2 – 90 minutes). Students will test on both days at the same time. Testing times and locations were sent out to all student SCPS email on Friday.

10th Grade FSA ELA Reading will be given on Monday, May 3 (Session 1 – 90 minutes) and Tuesday, May 4 (Session 2 – 90 minutes). Students will test on both days at the same time. Testing times and locations were sent out to all student SCPS email on Friday.

Connect Students: Testing times and locations were sent out to student SCPS email on Friday. Students will test on both days at the same time. Please arrive 5-10 minutes before your starting time and go to your testing location. Students testing at 11:42am should arrive around 11:30am and do not need to eat lunch on campus. Students can be picked up approximately 90 minutes after their start time or if they choose to remain on campus will attend their regular classes.

# **Testing (cont'd)**

Scheduled Testing Times: Students will test at the following times – 7:20am, 9:19am, or 11:42am. Specific testing times were emailed to students and are posted outside Media and in the REF Room.

# EOC Assessments (Algebra 1, Geometry, Biology, US History)

Specific testing times and locations will be sent out to student SCPS email a week before the scheduled testing date. Students who are taking Algebra 1, Geometry, Biology, or US History through SCVS will also be included to test and the testing time and location will be emailed a week before the testing date. You do not need to call the school to schedule this and you will automatically be scheduled for it.

Per the Florida Department of Education (FDOE), no remote administrations are available for any statewide summative assessments.

### **Advanced Placement Exams**

This year, Seminole County Public Schools will be administering paper and pencil Advanced Placement exams during College Board's Administration 1 which will take place May 3-7, 10-12, 14, and 17 at Lake Mary High School.All students are required to take the AP exam for the AP courses in which they are enrolled.Students are required to have a Photo ID. If a student does not have a Photo ID, they can request a school ID at the following link:

Exams will be given at 8am (please arrive by 7:30am) and 12pm (please arrive at 11:30am). Specific information about the AP testing day procedures was sent to student SCPS email last week. The Student Letter, which includes testing dates and testing locations is attached.


