This application should take only 15 minutes to complete at the most. YOU DO NOT NEED ALL THE REQUIREMENTS MET BEFORE YOU APPLY. APPLY TODAY! All requirements are completed while in high school (GPA, SAT/ACT test scores and volunteer hours). Instruction to complete the application can be found on eCampus.

Advanced Placement

AP Exams will take place May 2-13 (schedule is attached). All exams will take place at Lake Mary High School. This is a reminder that students are expected to take the AP exam at the end of the course and if a student does not sit for the AP exam, there will be a \$40 unused exam fee.

Students are required to arrive no later than 30 minutes prior to their exam – 7:30am for the morning administration and 11:30am for the afternoon administration. Students will not be dismissed until the exam has officially ended. Students should bring the following on exam day:

- An acceptable calculator if the AP exam allows the use of a calculator
- A current government-issued or school-issued photo ID (students MUST have photo ID)
- No. 2 pencils for the multiple choice answer sheet
- Pens with black or dark blue ink for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for free-response questions in most exams

Students will be excused from all classes on the day(s) of their AP exam(s). Cell phones and smart watches will not be permitted in the testing room. Students may not be dismissed until the exam has officially ended.

Need Free Tutoring?

LMHS students now have access to on-demand, online, free tutoring through FEV Tutor from 7:00 am - 10:00 pm every day.

How do students access this free service?

Students need only log into clever and search for the FEV Tutor tile. Click on the tile, and once the program opens, students will see a button at the top, center for on demand tutoring and will also see a button to set up a tutoring session in the future.

What subjects are covered? All core subjects are covered, and students can even request a Spanish translation. Tutors can also help with Plato classes for credit recovery.

Athletics Updates

Boys Volleyball

Congratulations to the boys volleyball team on their District Championship win on Thursday night. The top ranked team in the state and 14th ranked team in the nation swept Spruce Creek to win the title. The team now begins the state playoffs with a Regional Quarterfinal matchup at home on Tuesday night against North Marion. Come out to the Boyd E. Karns Gymnasium at 7:00pm on Tuesday night and see this team begin it's chase for a state championship.



Boys Lacrosse

The boys lacrosse team's pursuit of a state championship continued this past week. The boys ended up getting a big victory, 10-8 to move them on to the Regional Final as one of only eight teams remaining. The team then traveled to Jacksonville on Saturday night to for a battle with top ranked Ponte Vedra. In a great game of top ranked teams, the Rams unfortunately came up one goal short as their season came to an end. This program, it's coaches, and all of it's great players have had an amazing run and have every reason to hold their heads high.

Testing Update

Spring 2022 State Assessments: FSA and EOC

Unlike last year, this year all students are expected to participate in these assessments. Results of the tests play a vital role in determining your student's growth and progress during the school year. If your student is enrolled in a course with a state required End of Course Exam, the results of the exam will count as 30% of your student's final semester grades in the course. Encourage your student to give their best effort.

End of Course exams are for students who are currently taking Algebra 1, Geometry, Biology, and US History. The EOC will count as 30% of the student's final grade. For the math EOCs, even if students have met the math graduation requirement through a concordant score on PSAT, the EOC counts as 30% of the final grade in the math course.

- **Electronic Devices:** Students are not permitted to have any electronic devices, including but not limited to cell phones, smartphones, and smartwatches, at any time during testing OR during breaks (e.g., restroom), even if they are turned off or students do not use them. If your student is found with an electronic device, his or her test will be invalidated.
- **Leaving Campus:** If your student begins a test session and leaves campus before completing it (for lunch, an appointment or illness, etc.), he or she WILL NOT be allowed to complete that test session. If your student does not feel well on the day of testing, it may be best for him or her to wait and be tested on a make-up day. Please remember not to schedule appointments on testing days.
- **Attendance:** Attendance for testing will be reflected in Skyward 48 hours after the testing date.

FSA ELA Reading Assessments (Grades 9 and 10)

9th and 10th grade FSA ELA Reading will take place this week. 9th grade students will test on Monday, May 2 (Session 1) and Tuesday, May 3 (Session 2). 10th grade students will test on Thursday, May 5 (Session 1) and Friday, May 6 (Session 2).

This assessment is 90 minutes in length for each session. Students should bring earbuds on both testing days.

Students have been emailed their specific testing date, time, and testing location. The testing location list is also posted outside Media.
