Application Reminders: Complete the applications entirely and make sure to put correct graduation date and start of semester. It is preferred that students type the form and sign in ink.



Spring 2022 State Assessments: FSA and EOC

Unlike last year, this year all students are expected to participate in these assessments. Results of the tests play a vital role in determining your student's growth and progress during the school year. If your student is enrolled in a course with a state required End of Course Exam, the results of the exam will count as 30% of your student's final semester grades in the course. Encourage your student to give their best effort.

End of Course exams are for students who are currently taking Algebra 1, Geometry, Biology, and US History. The EOC will count as 30% of the student's final grade. For the math EOCs, even if students have met the math graduation requirement through a concordant score on PSAT, the EOC counts as 30% of the final grade in the math course.

- **Electronic Devices:** Students are not permitted to have any electronic devices, including but not limited to cell phones, smartphones, and smartwatches, at any time during testing OR during breaks (e.g., restroom), even if they are turned off or students do not use them. If your student is found with an electronic device, his or her test will be invalidated.
- Leaving Campus: If your student begins a test session and leaves campus before completing it (for lunch, an appointment or illness, etc.), he or she WILL NOT be allowed to complete that test session. If your student does not feel well on the day of testing, it may be best for him or her to wait and be tested on a make-up day. Please remember not to schedule appointments on testing days.
- Attendance: Attendance for testing will be reflected in Skyward 48 hours after the testing date.

US History EOC and Biology EOC

US History EOC will take place on Monday, May 9 for all students who are currently taking US History standard or honors. The US History EOC is 30% of the student's final grade in the course. Biology EOC will take place on Tuesday, May 10 for all students who are currently taking Biology standard or honors. The Biology EOC is 30% of the student's final grade in the course.

Both of these assessments are 160 minutes in length or longer, if needed.

Students and parents have been emailed the testing date, time, and testing location. The testing location list is also posted outside Media.

Algebra EOC

Algebra 1 EOC will take place on Thursday, May 12 (Session 1 - 90 minutes) and Friday, May 13 (Session 2 - 90 minutes). This is for all students who are currently taking Algebra 1 standard or honors. The Algebra EOC is 30% of the student's final grade in the course.

Even if students have met the math graduation requirement through a concordant score on PSAT, the EOC counts as 30% of the final grade in the math course.

Testing time and location will be emailed to students and parents this week.

National SAT/ACT Testing Dates

Students can register through College Board (<u>www.collegeboard.com</u>) and ACT (<u>www.act.org</u>) to take these tests on a Saturday National Testing Date.

Advanced Placement

AP Exams will take place May 2-13 (schedule is attached). All exams will take place at Lake Mary High School. This is a reminder that students are expected to take the AP exam at the end of the course and if a student does not sit for the AP exam, there will be a \$40 unused exam fee.

Students are required to arrive no later than 30 minutes prior to their exam - 7:30am for the morning administration and 11:30am for the afternoon administration. Students will not be dismissed until the exam has officially ended.

Students should bring the following on exam day:

- An acceptable calculator if the AP exam allows the use of a calculator
- A current government-issues or school-issued photo ID (students MUST have photo ID)
- No. 2 pencils for the multiple choice answer sheet
- Pens with black or dark blue ink for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for freeresponse questions in most exams

Students will be excused from all classes on the day(s) of their AP exam(s). Cell phones and smart watches will not be permitted in the testing room. Students may not be dismissed until the exam has officially ended.

Specific AP testing information, including testing room locations, has been emailed to all students and parents.

Make-up AP exams are only offered for College Board approved reasons.
