

IT'S TIME FOR TESTING!

LMHS students prepare for nine weeks exams, C9As, SAT School Day, and FSA ELA and EOC Retakes

The month of October brings hopefully cooler weather and definitely a number of important tests for LMHS students. This upcoming week marks the last full week of instruction before students begin their nine weeks assessments on Wednesday, Oct. 7th. It is important to realize that all students, in all courses, will be given some time of nine weeks assessment that will be counted as 20% of their nine weeks grades. However, only students in subjects that are part of high-stakes assessments at the end of the school year will be taking a C9A, which counts as both a progress monitoring instrument and 20% of students' grades.

Who takes a C9A? Students enrolled in 9th and 10th grade English, Algebra I, Geometry, and U.S. History. Student participation in these C9As is mandatory, and these assessments must be taken without the help of another person or use of notes or other materials. You may be asking, how will the C9A tests look different for face-to-face students vs. Seminole Connect students?

Face-to-Face: Students will complete the exam(s) through EdInsight (computer based) and students will receive their testing ticket(s) from their teacher on the exam day in class.

Seminole Connect: Students will complete the exam(s) through EdInsight (computer based) and will receive their testing ticket through their SCPS email on the exam day. Students will log in to Clever and then EdInsight and will use their log in information on the testing ticket to access the exam. Students will take their exam(s) during their scheduled exam period and the use of a camera during the test administration is required to maintain security and to ensure valid data is reported to the State. Students will receive more specific information through their teachers before the exam day.

Attached to this Ram Report, parents will find a chart that provides information about who will participate in each of the following exams: SAT School Day, FSA ELA Retakes, and EOC Retakes. Please note that the students taking EOC Retakes are doing so to qualify for a Scholars Diploma if they missed an EOC in the Spring. An application to take an EOC is also attached to this Ram Report.

RESOURCES FOR STUDENTS & FAMILIES

Food Bank and School Supplies

Lake Mary High School stocks a food bank to assist our students and families who need assistance. Students may see either our social worker, Natiria Vazquez, or our discipline secretary, Krista Presti, to receive food items at the end of each school day. Families can pick up a bag of groceries each Friday from 9-11. All you need to do is park under the front overhang and let the front desk secretary you would like to receive a bag of groceries.

Students may also receive backpacks and school supplies if needed. We have plenty in stock! Students needing school supplies may ask Ms. Moore in the administrative office or Ms. Vazquez, our school social worker, and supplies will be provided.

Free Breakfast and Lunch

SCPS Red Apple Dining is now offering free breakfast and lunch value meals to all students. You do not need to fill out a free lunch form to receive this benefit. Students need only request the value meal in our school cafeteria, and the meal will be provided at no cost.

SpeakOut Hotline

Students are encouraged to help keep our campus safe by utilizing the SpeakOut hotline and/or P3 campus app to report concerns anonymously. Reports made through these outlets are completely anonymous and cannot be traced back to the student who is reporting.



WebEx Instructions and Protocols for Connect Students

SCPS has recently taken measures to firm up security measures in WebEx to ensure that individuals outside of our school system are not able to enter classroom WebEx sessions. As a result, students are asked to adhere to the following protocols when logging into WebEx:

- Students are to log in to the Portal/Clever, and then click on the Webex tile to access Webex.
- Upon logging into the Webex tile/app, students can then enter the address to their teacher's meeting.
- Upon following these procedures, students will be automatically admitted to their class, even if it is locked.

Students not using the appropriate credentials will automatically be placed in their teacher's classroom lobby and will have to wait to be admitted.

Most teachers have also established WebEx protocols for their Connect students. If you are a parent of a Connect student, please review those protocols with your child and help to ensure they are being followed.

It is critically important that Connect students log in to their WebEx sessions on time and remain present and alert during the entire class period to ensure they are staying on track with their lessons.
