- Provide a Parent Resource Center

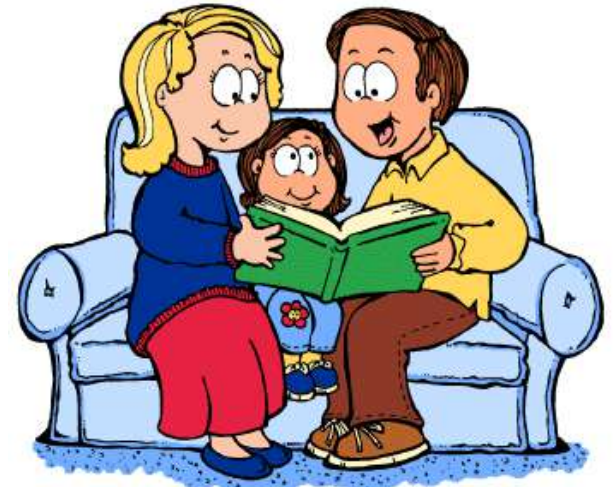

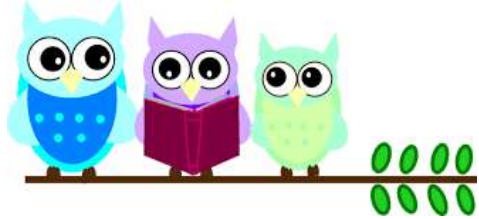
