ABSENT, LATE WORK, & EXTRA CREDIT:

If a student is absent from class, it is the student's kuleana to follow up on Blackboard and/or a classmate and/or Ms. Reeder to find out what was missed. Blackboard is a sequential program and will pick up right where the student left off.

Each topic of study will have an exam, ALL lessons and work will be due on or before the Exam date. Late work, with few exceptions, will be accepted after each Exam date after approved by Ms. Reeder

Extra credit is not given. Students need to keep up with their work and see Ms. Reeder at the first sign of trouble. There are no exceptions.

ASSIGNMENTS & GRADING:

There will be a series of assignments with our new Blackboard program and curriculum. It is going to be important that students stay up to date with completing their assignments. It will be rare for students to do work outside of their scheduled class times, (remote and in-class), but it will happen upon occasion.

For each unit of study (module) students will take a pre-test (1 point for completion), and a series of assignments in the unit, (scores vary), class participation (remote and in-class), discussion assessments, and a unit or module exam. The number of assignments will vary between units of study as some require more assignments than others, but the percentages for will always be the same.
