Hi students! Complete each of the four activities below in any order. I'm excited to see what you discover!

1. Try **Digital Art**: Download one or both of these free apps and experiment with the tools to create a work of digital art. Take a screenshot of your final work and upload it to your Google Classroom.

[Assembly](#): For graphic design

2. **Drawing Challenges**: Complete one or more of the drawing challenges with any materials and colors you want. Take a photo of your artwork and upload it to your Google Classroom when complete.
 - Create a drawing using **8 different lines** and **8 different shapes**.
 - Make a **continuous line drawing**—that means, make a drawing without ever lifting your pencil off of the paper!
 - Draw a noun (person, animal, place, or thing) using your **imagination**, then **observe** the same noun in real life, and draw them from **observation**. Look really closely and carefully at what you are drawing!
 - Draw a map of an **imaginary world**.
 - Find something **tiny**, and draw it REALLY BIG. Include all the details!
 - Write out the **alphabet**, and turn each letter into a noun (person, animal, place, or thing). For example:




3. Play a **Drawing Game** with a friend or family member:

Make a Monster




Fold a paper into **3** sections.




Draw a head on the top section. Any kind of head—human, animal, monster, alien, etc. Draw a little bit of the neck onto the next sections, and fold it back so no one can see the head.



Pass it to your friend. Draw a body and arms in the second section. Any kind of body! Draw a little bit of the body onto the next section, and fold it back so no one can see the body.




Pass it back. Draw the legs and feet in the third section. Any kind of feet!



Unfold your paper to reveal your crazy monster. Add color!

Beautiful Oops



Make a simple, small scribble on a piece of paper.



Pass it to your friend. They have to use their imagination to turn the scribble into something amazing! See how this artist turned the scribble into a hungry dinosaur?
