SS8H3 and **SS8H4** Expert Groups Task: You and your group members are to become experts on your assigned topic(s). You will create a Power Point Presentation, a guided note sheet, and a short quiz to be used to teach the rest of the class about your assigned topic.

Be sure to include the following information:

- What happened? How did it happen? Who was there? Why did it happened? When did it happen? Where did it happen?
- Presentations must include pictures, words, and video clips.
- Presentations should be no longer than 8 minutes and no shorter than 5 minutes.
- You must have a minimum of 8 slides with a minimum of 6 pictures.
- The last slide of all presentations must contain a 5 question quiz over the information you have presented. (You will be responsible for providing me with an answer key for your quiz)

You will be the teacher. Be sure to make your presentation easy to understand and follow, as well as interesting for your audience. You must include all important information students are required to know about your specific topic. Groups are as follows:

Group 3: Elijah Clarke, Austin Dabney and the Battle of Kettle Creek

Group 4: Strengths and Weaknesses of the GA Constitution of 1777 and the Articles of Confederation

Group 5: Constitutional Convention, Constitutional Compromises, reasons why Georgia ratified the new Constitution

Group 6: Abraham Baldwin and William Few. Who were they and what were their roles and contributions to the convention.

Group 7: French and Indian War. When, Where, Why, What, Who and How? Make sure you give the importance – the effects of the War

Group 8: Intolerable Acts: Who, What, Where, When, Why, and How? Make sure you include the cause of the acts and the effects of the acts.

Group 9: Declaration of Independence: Who, What, Where, When, Why, and How? Make sure you give causes and effects – especially how it affects the colonists and England, what does this lead to, make sure you include the 1st and 2nd continental congresses.

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
