## **Graduation Requirements**

To earn a standard high school diploma, you need a minimum of:

- >24 credits
- **▶** 2.0 *Unweighted* GPA
- ▶ Pass Grade 10 FAST Exam (ELA) 3+
- > Pass End-of-Course exam 3+ Algebra 1 and/or Geometry
- **►** Must take 1 online course
- Concordant Scores SAT and ACT scores

### 24 Credits required to graduate:

- **► English** 4 credits
- ➤ Math 4 credits (Must include Alg 1, Geom)
- ➤ Science 3 credits (Must include Biology)
- ➤ Social Studies 3 credits (World, US, Gov't/Econ)
- >HOPE 1 credit
- **Performing Arts** − 1 credit
- **Electives** 8 credits

\*Must have 1 Online course credit

## What are colleges looking for?

#### More than the minimum:

- Additional academic courses in Math, Science, and Foreign Language (2+ years in same language)
- ➤ Rigor of course schedule
- ➤ GPA & class rank
- >SAT or ACT scores
- > Participation in extracurricular activities
- > Leadership abilities
- Community service hours or work hours

#### Courses come in 4 sizes

> Standard

- ➤ Honors faster paced and more rigorous than standard.
- ➤ Advanced Placement (AP) College level courses. Potential increase in workload, advanced reading and writing, more independent. AP Exam in May.

➤ Dual Enrollment (DE) — Actual College courses taken through UNF or SJRSC. Can be virtual or on PVHS campus, or on the College campus.

### Blended vs. Modified

<u>Blended schedule</u>—underclass students takes a combination of seven courses in person on campus and virtually.

Students can take the virtual course on campus in a monitored computer lab, or off campus.

Modified Schedule – Seniors are allowed to take less than 7 credits IF they are on pace for graduation at the end of their Junior year.
