Rising 11th Grade

Written Directions to Select Elective Courses in Infinite Campus

1. Log into Infinite Campus/Parent Portal on Wednesday, February 17th at 4:00pm.
2. Choose the student you wish to register from the tab at the top (if you have more than one child).
3. On the left-hand side of the screen towards the bottom, click on **MORE**. Then select **COURSE REGISTRATION**. Next, select the school showing (it should reflect **LAMBERT HIGH SCHOOL**).

At this time, you will be able to view the academic course recommendations entered by your child's current Science and Math teachers, but cannot make changes to those courses in the portal. If you do NOT see a Science or Math recommendation, you will need to request Science or Math courses through the **COURSE WAIVER**. If you see an incorrect Science or Math course, you will need to request changes to these classes through the **COURSE WAIVER**.

4. Use **Course Registration Sheets** in this packet for making course choices for **ELA, SOCIAL STUDIES, and ELECTIVES**. Refer to the Course Digest (Forsyth County Schools website) for any pre-requisite information about courses. Link available on Lambert HS website.
5. Follow the prompt to add "**Elective Course**" and "**Alternates**". You must select a minimum of 3 alternative courses. *The courses you are selecting are course requests, not a FINAL schedule.*
6. **You may search by course name OR number.**
7. If you wish to drop a course after you have selected it, then click the class and follow the prompt to drop. You may no longer make changes to course requests once the window for your grade level closes at 4pm on Tuesday, February 23rd.

Important Reminders:

- You need a total of **8 courses (80/80)** in Parent Portal. *The additional course to complete 80/80 will be your Lunch and Learn period. It will be added automatically prior to the opening of your registration window.*
- **Yearlong courses = 1.0**
- **Semester courses = .50** (keep semester courses paired as shown on the course sheet - Ex. Driver Education/General PE 1), **enter both course numbers.**
- Selection is not first come first serve in securing a seat in a course.
- You can make elective selections and changes at any time the Portal is open - see dates below.
- Student course requests can be viewed through Parent Portal ONLY during the **Verification window >March 30th, March 31st, and April 1st, 2021.**

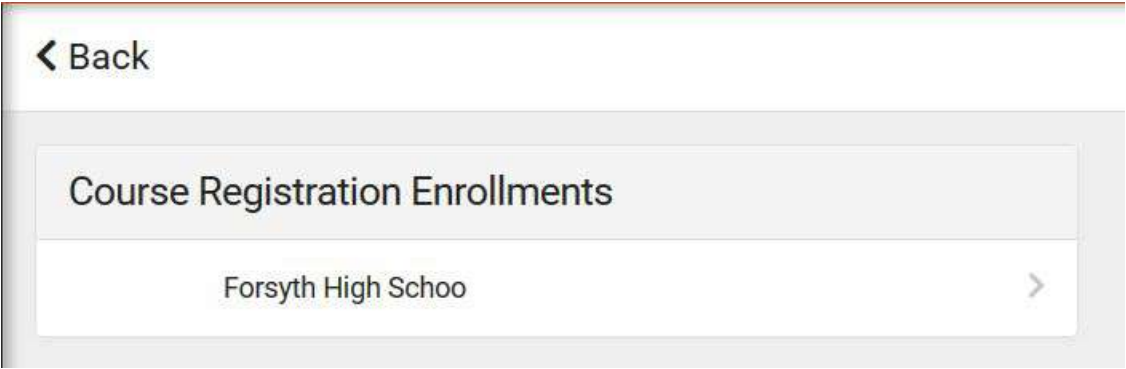
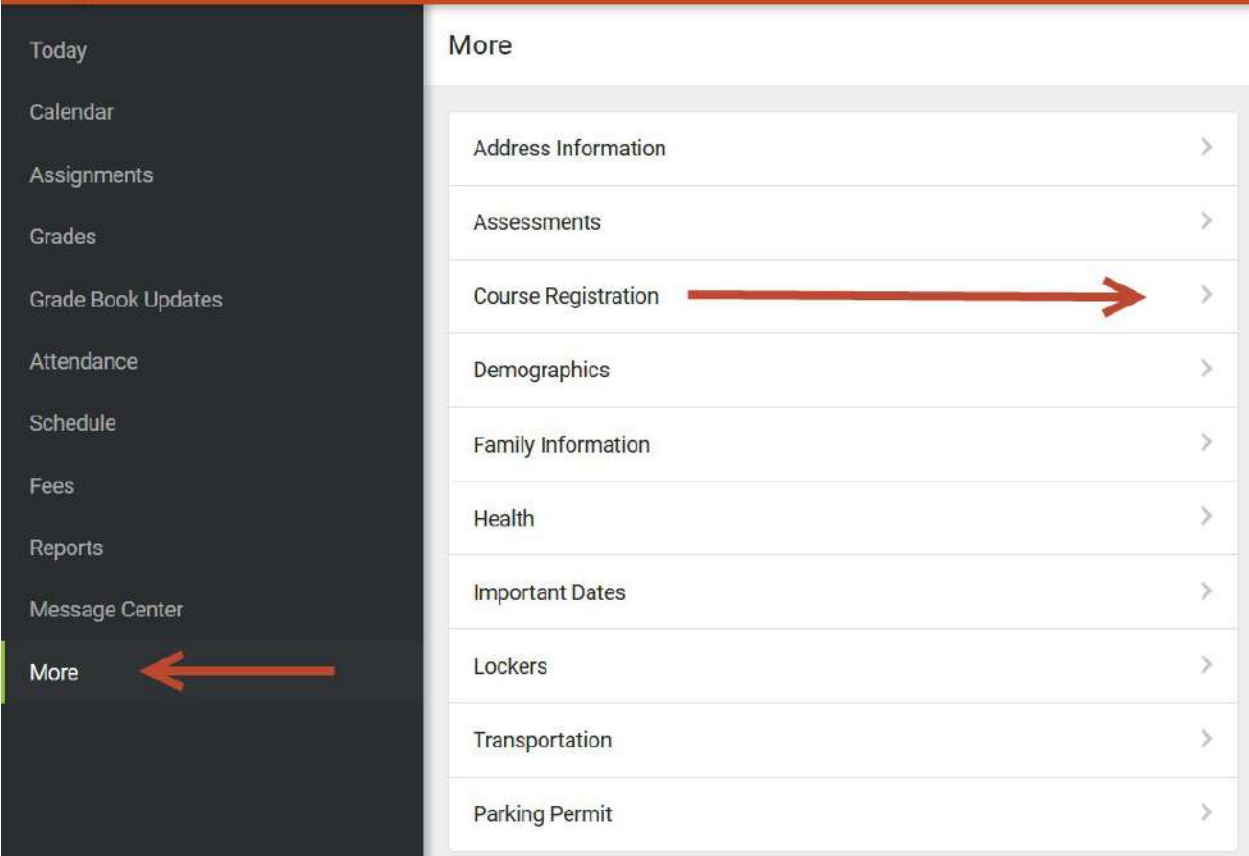

Log into Parent Portal

Please log into your parent portal account. IF you do not have a parent portal account, please contact your school you are currently attending. On the left-hand side of your screen at the bottom, select More. Then select Course Registration. Then select the school showing.



The next screen to appear will show you the courses your student has been recommended for next year. These will be listed under the title "Required". You will also notice at the top of the screen percent complete bar and Units (xx/xx). Each course is comprised of units. Normally, a yearlong course equals 10 units and a semester course equals 5 units. You will be able to select Elective courses until you reach the maximum of 70 units. All courses requested after the 70 units will be Alternate Courses.

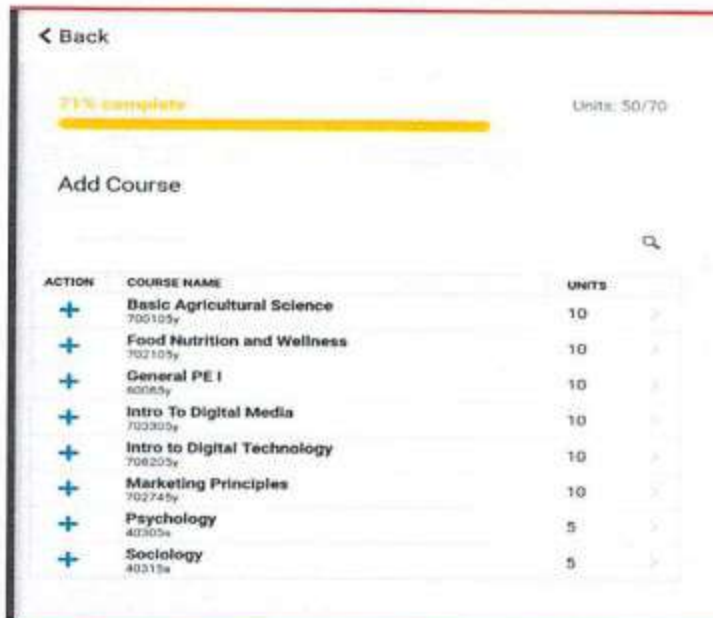

The next screen after selecting Add Course will list all elective course options.

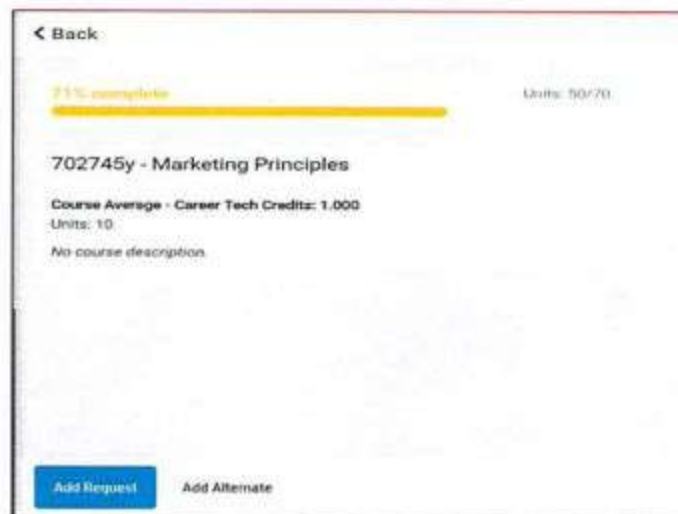
If you know the course number or course name you can type it in the search bar OR if you see it listed, select the arrow next to the course name.



A new screen will appear – IF you see Course History listed, this means the student has already taken or is currently taken the course. Do not select the course. Select back and make another choice.



If you do not see Course History listed, then you can select either Add Request or Add Alternate at the bottom. You will only select Alternate when the units shown at the top reach 70/70



Once you selected the course, it will put a red X next to that course. If you selected the course in error or would like to change your select, just select the course again and a pop-up screen will appear asking if you would like to delete the course request.

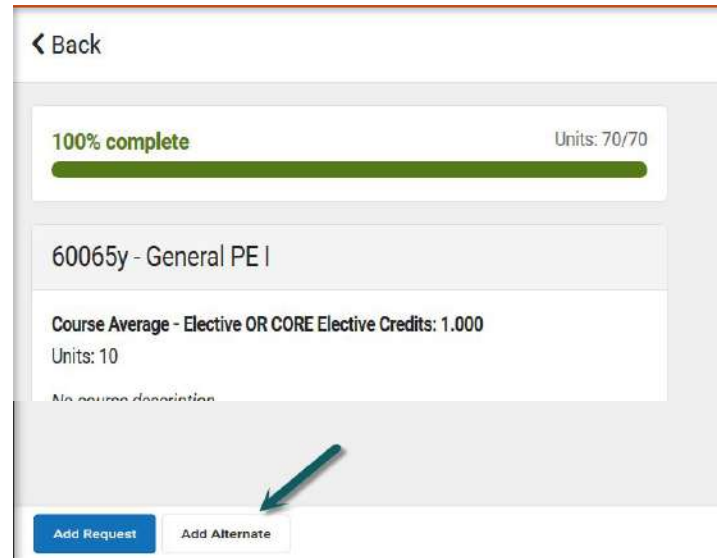

Lambert students will see recommendations for SCIENCE and MATH courses.

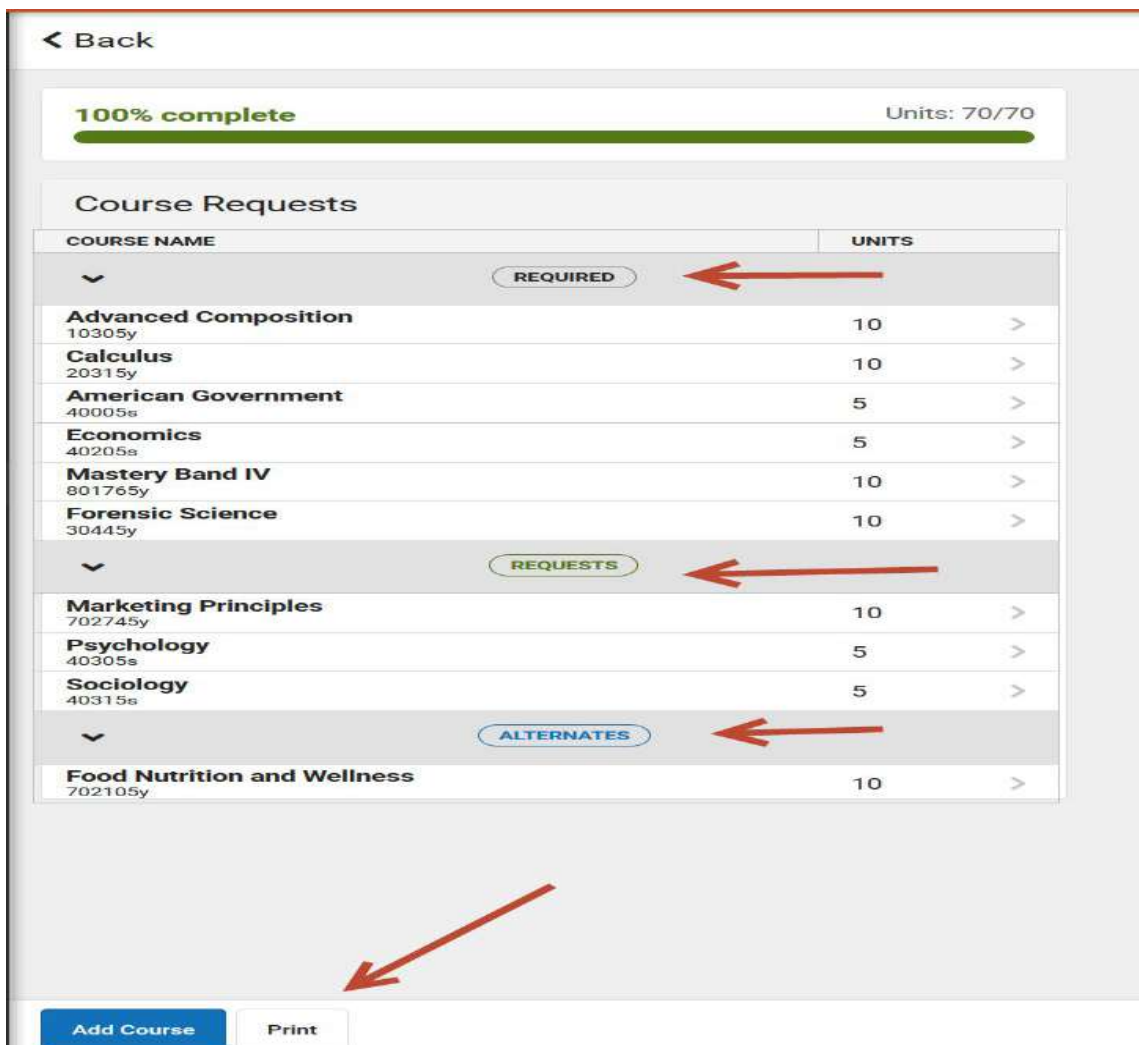
- If you do not see a Science or Math recommendation, you will need to request a Science/Math course through the WAIVER.

SOCIAL STUDIES	___ U.S. History - 40375y ___ AP U.S. History - 40125y	<p>Students will select their Social Studies course for next year.</p> <p><i>Students seeking AP U.S. History should be prepared for intensive vocabulary work, a dedicated outside of school commitment to homework completion and preparation for assessments. Students do not have to have completed AP Human Geography or AP World History to select AP U.S. History as juniors; however, they should be prepared for an increased expectation for independent study, time spent on course work outside of class, and the elevated writing and reading requirements for this course.</i></p>	
WORLD LANG.	<p>Students will select their World Language Course.</p> <p>Two consecutive years of a world language are required for admission to a 4-year college in Georgia; however, World Language courses are classified as electives for High School graduation.</p> <p>Spanish BLOCK Courses - Students seeking to accelerate their language study may elect to take two periods of Spanish next year.
