Important Tasks for 12th Grade



Important Tasks for 12th Grade

Visit	Visit post-secondary campuses
Finalize	Finalize resume of activities
Apply	Apply to University/College/Vocational School
Apply	Apply for financial aid on October 1 •FAFSA (Federal Application for Student Aid) •FFAA (Florida Financial Aid Application, including Bright Futures Scholarship)
Apply	Apply for scholarships
Request	In May, request a final transcript to be sent to the post-secondary institution that student is attending

ACT & SAT Information

VERY IMPORTANT - Students will be evaluated for Bright Futures based on official test scores from the FDOE repository. To ensure Office of Student Financial Assistance obtains official test scores: Ensure demographics on your test registration and high school transcript match; and request your official test scores be sent to one of Florida's 12 state universities when registering for the ACT and/or SAT. 

Opportunities from parent and students' current employers

What should seniors do to qualify for the Bright Futures scholarship?

Review	Review Bright Futures report
See	See your school counselor if there are any errors on the report or transcript
Take	Take note of what is 'missing' to qualify for each award
Take	Take steps to improve the Bright Futures GPA if it is borderline
Retake	Retake ACT and/or SAT as needed and send scores to Florida universities
Turn in	Turn in any remaining community service/work hours by winter break
Apply on	Apply on October 1, even if you don't have the qualifications yet

Bright Futures Requirements



*Student must earn either the required volunteer service OR paid work hours, but not a combination of both.



Your Senior schedule should set you up for your first year out of high school



Going to a 4 year college or university? Take classes that will prepare you for your major. Take more classes beyond the minimum required for graduation

02

Going to a vocational school? Take classes at FCTC to get a jump start on your education for free. 03

Going to SJRSC or FSCJ or another state college? Take classes that will prepare you for your major. Take more classes beyond the minimum required for graduation



Reduced schedule/ Executive Intern (CO-OP)? Reduced – 12th graders can reduce up to 3 periods during their senior year if the student **is on track** for an on time high school graduation.

- Student should provide their own transportation.
- Morning or afternoon reduced periods cannot be guaranteed.
- BHS Senior Reduced Schedule Form must be given to counselor at course selection appointment.

Blended – Blend of classes at both Beachside HS and dual enrollment at either SJRSC or FCTC.

- Student should provide their own transportation.
- Seniors can choose to take all their classes with SJRSC (must take at least 12 credit hours per term)

Executive Intern (CO-OP) – Students can have up to 4 executive intern periods cumulative during 11th and 12th grade and will be allowed to leave campus early.

- Students should provide their own transportation
- Students should work 25 hours a month for every period on their schedule.
- Assignments and pay stubs will be turned in to earn a grade in the course.
- This is a credit bearing class and will count towards one of the 4 periods students should take senior year.

Blended Schedule with SJRSC Dual Enrollment

- Student should tell counselor their intention to take dual enrollment at meeting
- Counselor will not remove any courses from schedule until SJRSC gives us notification that the student is enrolled in courses
- Student and parents should read all the frequently asked questions on the BHS dual enrollment website: <u>https://www-bhs.stjohns.k12.fl.us/guidance/dual-enrollment-sjrsc/</u>
- Student should pay attention to Schoology posts and Remind text messages, so they don't miss dual enrollment deadline
- SJRSC and BHS Classes
 - Traditional dual enrollment students may take a maximum of ten (10) credit hours in the fall term, ten (10) credit hours in the spring term, and six (6) to eight (8) credit hours (a maximum of 2 courses total) for the summer term
- SJRSC Classes (No BHS Classes)
 - Early admissions students must take a minimum of twelve (12) and a maximum of sixteen (16) credit hours each fall and spring term.



Blended Schedule with SJRSC Dual Enrollment

ENC 1101 = 1 English credit ENC 1102 = 1 English credit MAC 1105 = 1 Math credit

POS 1041 = 0.50 US Government credit ECO 2013 = 0.50 Economics credit

ECO 2023 = 0.50 Economics credit

Blended Schedule with FCTC Dual Enrollment

- The classes at FCTC are extremely limited
- FCTC application paperwork is due to them by March 10, so we need the completed applications by the student's registration appointment

Senioritis (n.)

A crippling disease that strikes high school seniors.

Symptoms: laziness, an over-excessive wearing of track pants, and sweatshirts. Lack of studying, repeated absences, and a dismissive attitude. The only known cure is a phenomenon known as Graduation.

• It's a thing.

- If a student doesn't earn all the graduation requirements, then they don't participate in the ceremony – even if they are just .50 credit short or their GPA is a 1.99999
- Parents, during senior year, check HAC again like you did when they were little so there are no surprises. Yes, even the parent of the kid who never even earned a C.
