How do I stay informed?

- Online textbooks are available for all core classes and the links are located on the LPA website under Links for Students.
- Usernames and passwords are the same for all accounts
- Teachers use Schoology in lieu of a class website.
- Students will use Schoology to view upcoming activities, tests, and important class information.
- Home Access Center (HAC) allows parents and students to view grades online. Students use the same username and password for all of their textbooks and HAC.

Planners/Schoology

- Organization is the key to success! A planner is given to each student at the start of school.
- Students should record all homework and assignments in the student planner.
- Parents will want to check their child's planner and Schoology on a daily basis to assist the child in the development of organizational skills

Organization = Success

- Write assignments in planner
- Check Schoology site daily
- Put homework in the correct class folder/notebook
- Study Buddy, have other student's phone numbers to call for help or questions about homework or assignments.
- Do homework when assigned

Homework

- Homework is to be expected for students in grades 6th -8th grade
- Each night, students will have approximately sixty minutes of homework
- Your child will have a Schoology account
- There is also a calendar that will show when each assignment and upcoming activity is for the student for all their classes

Policies and other information

- Your child has options for re-assessment.
- Students who score a 69% or below on a summative assignment (test, project, research paper) can participate in grade recovery to achieve a passing score of 70%. Students will have to print out and have parent sign contract which is found on the 6th grade website and coordinate with the teacher for the retake.
- Promotion requires that academic requirements are met in the following core classes:
 - Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies




Supplies

District Exams

- District exams are administered every semester in ALL core courses.
- These exams are administered across the entire county.
- They are counted in the summative category as a regular test grade.
- The testing window is ALWAYS the last week of the quarter.

What are the math options for my child?

- LPA offers a variety of options for middle grades students depending on their individualized learning path:
 - o 6th standard/advanced/accelerated math
 - o 7th grade standard/advanced or Algebra 1 honors
 - o 8th grade Pre-Algebra, Algebra 1 honors, or Geometry
- Algebra I (Honors)- has EOC which is 30%
 of their final grade (High School course)
- Geometry (Honors)-has EOC (High School course)
- All 6th grade students will be placed in 6th grade standard, 6th advanced math, or 6th grade accelerated math based on their Math FSA scores and final math grades from 5th grade.

Course Option Verifications - 6th

All 6th Grade students will take PE and Adventures in Reading as two of their electives.

Please review elective course descriptions and rank your elective preferences for the third elective (1=highest, 3= lowest). We will do our best to give you the highest ranked course; however, due to schedule constraints and class size requirements we cannot guarantee that the course chosen will be available.

Beginning band - This full-year course is designed for students who have no previous musical training, where they will develop their musicianship while performing music in a concert band setting. Financial obligations and occasional time commitments outside of school hours are part of this course. There will be a fair share fee for this course of \$75 per student for the year. Most students will also need to purchase or rent an instrument for this course.

<u>Chorus</u> – In this year long course students will discover and sing a wide range of musical styles while developing vocal technique. Students will also receive an introduction to basic music theory and performance skills. Financial obligations and occasional time commitments outside of school hours are part of this course. No audition is required.

<u>Art</u> - This is a year-long class offered to the art enthusiast.

Course Verification Forms

Your child will bring home their course verification form tomorrow. On this form you will see:

- Core class recommendations ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies – write any class questions you may have on the form, sign the bottom, and return it to your child's homeroom teacher
- Elective registration form please number your choices 1 to 3 with 1 being the class you want the most

Advanced Reading – Adventures in Reading

- All 6th grade students who are not in intensive reading will be in the Advanced Reading elective.
- This year long course will help students increase reading fluency and endurance through advanced integrated experiences in the language arts.
- Students conduct novel studies and enhance their learning through comprehension strategies and study skills.



Physical Education

- All 6th grade students take a full year of P.E.
- Students cannot wear their school clothes to participate in physical education.
- Every student must have a PE uniform
- Uniforms can be purchased at a discount rate if ordered by the end of the school year (shorts and a t shirt). The online order form will be available on the LPA website.
- Students must wear sneakers
- Students are given adequate time to change at the beginning and end of class

Band 1

- Band is a year-long commitment that meets every day
- Parent permission is required to participate in Band
- Students perform for Night of the Arts and other opportunities throughout the school year
- Instruments may be rented or purchased at a cost to parents
- Practice = Homework, students are expected to practice at least 20 minutes a day on their instrument
- Band Boosters support Band students through "Fair Share" fee

2 Dimensional Art

- Students explore media and techniques used to create a variety of 2-D artworks through developing skills in drawing, painting, printmaking, and collage. Students practice, sketch, and manipulate the structural elements of art. Investigation of artworks from Western and non-Western cultures provide a means for students to expand their understanding and appreciation of the role of art in global culture.
- Student artists use an art criticism process to evaluate, explain, and measure artistic growth in personal or group works. This course incorporates hands-on activities and consumption of art materials.
- Final Exam is required

- Please check HAC as daily communication regarding homework does not occur

Dress Code

- Shorts & Skirts can't be shorter than fingertip length
- Leggings may be worn with a shirt that is fingertip length
- No tank tops or sleeveless shirts smaller than 3" wide
- No shirts that reveal midriffs or open backs
- No lace or shear shirts with tanks underneath
