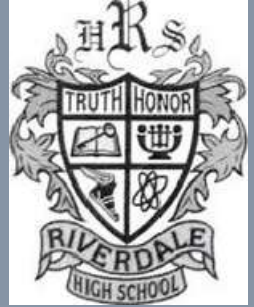

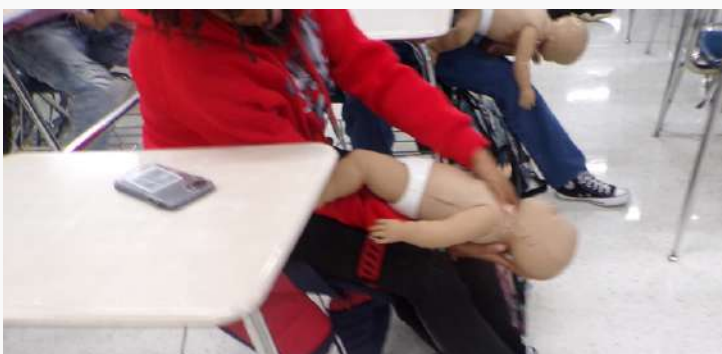
Introduction to Law, Public Safety, Corrections and Security

Pictured are Justice Wong-McMillian and students participating in the mock oral arguments.

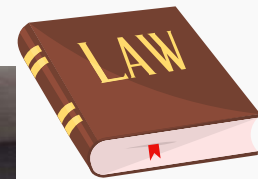

If I take the firefighter pathway does that mean I have to be a firefighter when I graduate?

No, you do not have to be a firefighter when you graduate. However, if you successfully complete the program the department may offer you a job.

If I do not take the Intro to Law and Public Safety class before my 11th-grade year can I still be enrolled in the firefighter pathway?

Unfortunately, no, you must have passed the Intro to Law & Public Safety class and be enrolled in the firefighter pathway before the first semester of your 11th-grade year.

Do I need special skills or knowledge to be enrolled in the firefighter pathway?

The only skills you need are time management, self-discipline, the ability to follow directions, the ability to commit to the program for both your junior and senior years, the willingness to work hard, and the ability to work in a team environment.

How do I know I am a good fit for the firefighter pathway?

- **Do you attend school regularly?**
- **Are you self-motivated?**
- **Can you follow simple directions?**
- **Do you have self-discipline?**
- **Are you a student who works hard?**
- **Are you a student who works through difficult situations?**
- **Are you willing to commit to the program in both your junior and senior year?**
- **Are you on track to graduate?**



If you answered YES to all of the questions above then you would be great for the firefighter pathway!
