<b>SUNRISE OVER FALLUJAH</b> by Walter Dean Myers	<b>Young Adult Fiction/War</b>
Robin “Birdy” Perry, a new army recruit from Harlem, isn’t quite sure why he joined the army, but he’s sure where he’s headed: Iraq. Birdy and the others in the Civilian Affairs Battalion are supposed to help secure and stabilize the country and successfully interact with the Iraqi people. Officially, the code name for their maneuvers is Operation Iraqi Freedom. But the young men and women in the CA unit have a simpler name for it: WAR.	
<b>PINNED</b> by Sharon G. Flake	<b>Young Adult Urban Fiction/2014 Florida Teens Read</b>
Autumn and Adonis have nothing in common and everything in common. Autumn is outgoing and quirky. Adonis is brilliant and practical. They both have disabilities. One seen. One unseen. Adonis knows exactly what he wants to accomplish in life and will not be distracted. Even so, he has a secret, and a heart he is determined Autumn will not pin.	
<b>I’M WITH STUPID</b> by Geoff Herbach	<b>Young Adult Fiction/Sports/Sequel</b>
This sequel to STUPID FAST continues the story of Felton Reinstein, high school football star. Felton has never been good with stress. Which is why he’s seriously freaking out. Revealing his college choice on national TV? It’s a heart attack waiting to happen. Deciding on a major for the next four years of his life? Ridiculous. He barely even knows who he is outside of football. And so... he embarks on The Epic Quest to Be Meaningful.	
<b>ELEANOR AND PARK</b> by Rainbow Rowell	<b>Young Adult Fiction/2014 Florida Teens Read</b>
Park Sheridan is a half-Korean, half Caucasian boy. Eleanor Douglas is an overweight red-haired girl. They are 2 misfit teens living in Omaha, Nebraska in 1986. Set over the course of one school year, this is the story of two star-crossed sixteen-year-olds – smart enough to know that first love almost never lasts, but brave and desperate enough to try.	

<b>CODE NAME VERITY by Elizabeth Wein</b>	<b>Teen Historical Fiction/Aviation</b>
<p>On October 11<sup>th</sup>, 1943, a British spy plane crashes in Nazi-occupied France. Its pilot and passenger are best friends – but only one of the girls has a chance at survival! Arrested by the Gestapo, “Verity” is given a choice: reveal her mission or face a grisly execution. They’ll get the truth – only it won’t be what they expect. “A thriller of the first order, and so much more – a brilliant, romantic dream of flight and friendship and bravery and heartbreak.” – L. As one of earth’s last survivors, Cassie is left with just herself and learnt the hard way to trust no one.</p>	
<b>THE MAZE RUNNER by James Dashner</b>	<b>Young Adult Fiction/Dystopia</b>
<p>When Thomas wakes up in the lift, the only thing he can remember is his name. He’s surrounded by strangers – boys whose memories are also gone. Outside the towering stone walls that surround the Glade is a limitless, ever-changing maze. It’s the only way out – and no one’s ever made it through alive. Then a girl arrives. The first girl ever. <p>The heart wrenching <i>New York Times</i> bestseller about the only known person born inside a North Korean prison camp to have escaped – Shin Dong-hyuk. Shin knew nothing of civilized existence – he saw his mother as a competitor for food, guards raised him to be a snitch, and he witnessed the execution of his mother and brother. Harden’s harrowing narrative exposes this hidden dystopia, focusing on an extraordinary young man who came of age inside Camp 14. It is a tale of endurance and courage, survival and hope.</p>	
<b>WHEN I WAS PUERTO RICAN by Esmeralda Santiago</b>	<b>Memoir</b>
