Dear Parent/Guardian of 11th grade student,

On Wednesday, March 24th, the District School Board of Pasco County and Wesley Chapel High School will offer the SAT free of charge to all 11th grade students. The SAT will be college-reportable and may also help students who have not yet met Algebra and/or FSA Reading graduation requirements.

The SAT includes four sections in three skill areas: Critical Reading, Mathematics, and Writing Skills. (Students may bring a calculator to use on one section of the math test.) SAT scores are beneficial to ALL students as they can be used to guide students with future career opportunities, scholarships, and post-secondary planning.

Consent for Accommodations Request: If your child requires a testing accommodation, please complete the request on the other side of this letter. **Students with IEPs, 504s or ELL accommodations do not automatically receive testing accommodations for national tests.** Signed consent/requests must be received by **Friday, January 29, 2021**. Please be aware that once SAT accommodation requests are approved by The College Board, students must use the accommodations. *If students are approved for extra time accommodations, they must stay the entire amount of time for which they are approved. Students cannot leave early, and they cannot move to the next test section until the allotted time has passed, even if they finish the section early. This is different from how district and state assessments are administered. Standard time for the SAT is three hours and 15 minutes. With accommodations, this can span several more hours. Please consider this when deciding if you would like to use accommodations for this particular test.*

Opt-Out of SAT: Parents, if you do not wish for your child to participate in this free assessment, please complete the tear-off portion of this letter and have your child return it to **Mrs. Faysash, College and Career Specialist (Student Services Building), by Friday, February 26, 2021.**
