Exhilarate	Stimulate, excite, gladden	Discourage, dispirit, dishearten, inhibit	The first landing on the moon, in the summer of 1969 exhilarated the nation.
Fallow	Unproductive, inert, dormant	Productive, fertile, prolific	In the drought-stricken region, there were millions of acres of fallow.
Redress	Rectify, correct, mitigate	No antonym	The accidents victims will seek redress for the injuries they suffered in the train crash.
Sojourn	Visit, stopover, brief stay	No antonym	No matter how short your sojourn in Paris, you must take time to go to the Louvre.
Urbane	Elegant	No antonym	An urbane host puts guest at ease by appearing totally confident and unruffled no matter what happens.
