

Dress Standards

Keeping modesty in mind, Sunset Beach Elementary School's dress code has been designed for the comfort and safety of your child. Your child's attire should conform to the following guidelines: *Fabrics should be opaque (no transparent fabrics) and should cover the torso (no bare midriff, chest or back)

*Shorts and skirts should not be shorter than the tip of the pinky finger when your child stands with his/her arms at his/her side.

*Pants and shorts should be in the correct size. No baggies or low-rise cut.

*T-shirts should not be altered.

*Clothing and/or accessories
with inappropriate references to
violence, drugs, sex and gangrelated activities are absolutely
unacceptable.

*Shoes or slippers must be worn.
Any student not properly attired will be asked to call home for appropriate items to be brought to school. Disciplinary consequences will result if violations are consistent.
Athletic shoes MUST be worn on the days students have PE. If students are not wearing athletic shoes, they will not be allowed to participate in PE class for that day. Our school Dress Standards also apply to ALL visitors on campus as well. Mahalo ©

 A) Get to know your child(ren)'s teacher or teachers

- B) Review the General Learner Outcomes expected of all students
- Review the standards and the proficiency expectations for your childs grade level
- D) Discuss your child(ren)'s entry level performance in language arts & math
- E) Share information about the curriculum, instruction and assessments that your child will experience in their class and grade level
- F) Review your child's report card and attendance

We will excuse all Sunset Beach Elementary School students an hour earlier from school during this conference time. Students will be released at 1:05 pm on Oct.23,24,26,27,30,31, 2017.
