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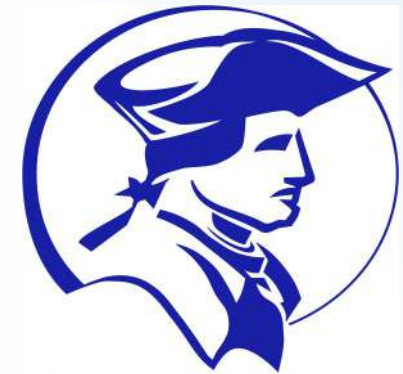

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Who are School Counselors?

School Counselors are certified educators who improve student success for ALL students by implementing a comprehensive school counseling program.

The School Counselor's Role

School Counselors design and deliver school counseling programs that improve student outcomes. They deliver developmentally appropriate activities and services that help students develop the mindsets and behaviors for student success and improve their achievement, attendance, and discipline.

Meeting the Needs of the Whole Child

One of the goals of Capital's educational mission is to meet the needs of the whole child.
