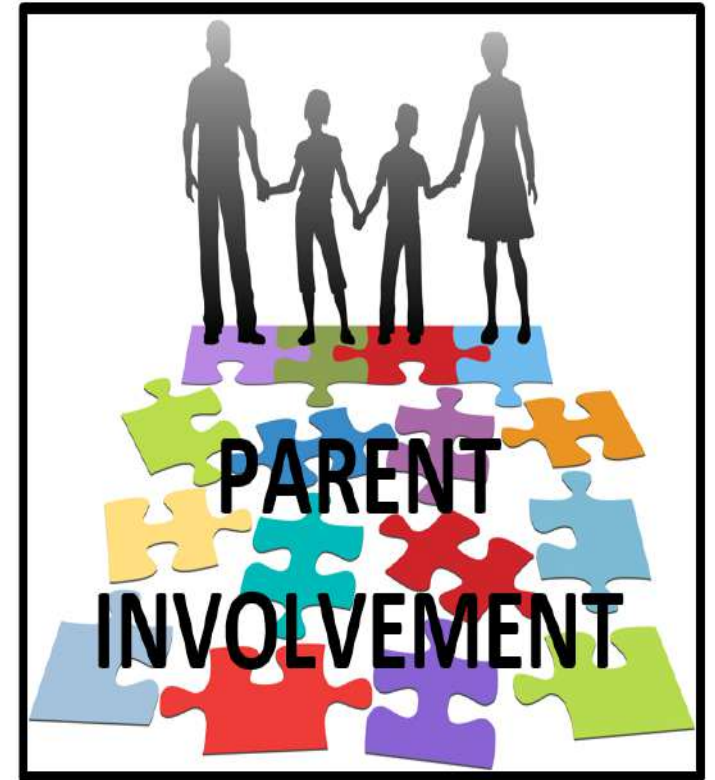
# PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT PLAN
